### Starting Monday, Feb. 22nd

We are so excited to be bringing students back face-to-face four days a week. At a previous meeting the board determined that once the verified cases/100,000 is at or below 400 and is continuing to decline, the transition to the Monday - Thursday schedule would begin. We are now at 374/100,000 and the board has decided to start the transition. Therefore, starting Monday, February 22nd, classes will slowly start to roll into the M-Th schedule.

Thank you all for using the task sheets and for initialing tasks once they are completed. This has really helped students finish and turn in ALL of their assignments! It was so exciting to see the extraordinary progress from students who had consistently completed all of their assignments last term, some students saw growth of up to three grade levels!

This past week we looked at the difference between active coping and passive coping. As we look at going into the lion's mouth of March, I am so proud of how your children have used active coping strategies defined as, "taking steps towards solving a problem or improving a situation." We will continue to ADAPT: Attitude, Define, Alternatives, Predict, and Try It Out.

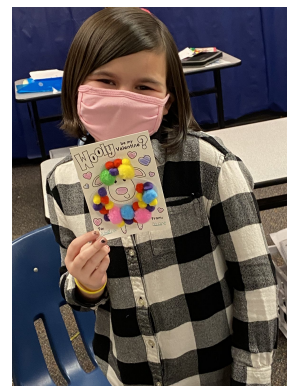
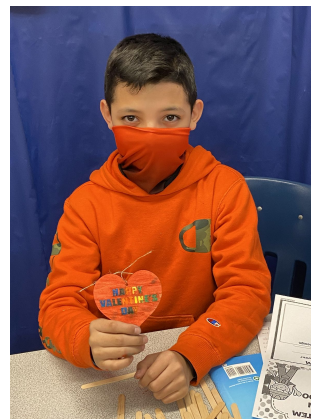


## Fabulous Fourth Graders

In ELA we have been focused on learning about giving presentations, as well as how to give and receive feedback.

Thank you very much for your participation in parent teacher conferences this week. We have had 100% participation which is fantastic as it is important we work as a team with our 4th graders regarding their learning. Next week we will be starting back with all 4th graders daily Monday -Thursday from 8:30-2:00. We will also be starting a Homework Club next week with a math focus for fourth graders from 2:00-3:15pm, with pick up from parents at 3:15pm, on Tuesdays and Thursdays in our classroom with Mrs. Tinnin. We are looking forward to what going to school everyday and having that extra homework support will do for our students.
