## INDUSTRIAL MAINTENANCE TRAINING SCHOLARSHIP STUDENT INFORMATION SHEET

### OBJECTIVE

Nissan North America, Inc. ("NNA") has established the Nissan Industrial Maintenance Training Scholarship to support the local community surrounding its manufacturing facility in Decherd, Tennessee, by creating a scholarship program for students at Franklin and surrounding counties, who plan to pursue a technical career. This scholarship program reaffirms NNA's ongoing commitment to education and the development of a skilled workforce.

Each year, a Nissan Scholarship Selection Committee will be appointed by NNA to select the scholarship recipients. The committee will annually award one scholarship to six seniors, in Franklin and surrounding counties, to attend the Fayetteville or Shelbyville campus of Tennessee College of Applied Technology, (TCAT).

### ELIGIBILITY and SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

To be eligible for the scholarship, a student must be a senior at an eligible High School with an overall grade point average ("GPA") at or above 2.5, or its equivalent, who has been enrolled in the high school's vocational curriculum.

Scholarship recipients will be awarded full tuition, including books and supplies, for up to five trimesters to attend TCAT. The scholarship recipients must be full-time students at TCAT, and work towards certification in their Industrial Maintenance program.

Once enrolled at TCAT, scholarship recipients must maintain a GPA at or above 3.0 GPA, or its equivalent, per trimester to keep their scholarship active. Scholarship recipients cannot reapply for this scholarship should they lose their eligibility.

### IMPORTANT DATES

Scholarship applications, and all required accompanying information described below, must be received by **March 27th**. Scholarship recipients will be notified in **April**.

### APPLICATION PROCEDURE

To apply, scholarship applicants must:

1. Complete the **Nissan Industrial Maintenance Training Scholarship Application**.
2. Submit a copy of your official **high school transcript**.
3. Submit a **500- to 750-word essay** describing why you are pursuing a technical education and what you regard as a proper work ethic.
4. Have one of your high school vocational instructors submit a **letter of recommendation**.
5. Provide all of the above information to your high school guidance counselor. **Ensure all supporting documentation is enclosed in a single packet, and do not staple the information.**
