Fluency: Lyrics@Learn is our new fluency program. Students are required to listen/read a passage 3 times a day for 4 days a week and answer increasingly difficult questions as the days progress. This program has students reading an average of 20 minutes a day and is improving their oral reading fluency every second they spend reading!
