Georgia state law mandates that by

June 30, 2015* every Georgia school system must choose a "flexibility option" in which to operate:

- Charter System
- Investing in Educational Excellence School System (IE²)
- Status Quo School System



What is the benefit of having a "flexibility option?"

The academic bottom line . . . increasing student achievement!



What does a charter system look like?

- > Defines the responsibilities of school principals, school governing boards, and the central administration in implementing plans to achieve performance improvements
- > The Charter System remains under the control and management of the local Board of Education
- > A five year contract between the school system and the state
- > Waivers and innovations can be phased in over the 5-year charter period
- > Describes specific operational and instructional innovations and waivers from state law that will be implemented
- > Defines common operational and instructional practices that will be in place for all schools
- > Details the performance that will be improved over the term of the contract




What will the charter system look like in Fannin County?

Charter System Performance Expectations:

- > Goal #1: During each year of the charter term, the number of students who meet or exceeds in mathematics will meet or exceed state averages in all grade levels and increase by a minimum of 1% on the Georgia Milestones Assessment (or other statewide accountability system).
- > Goal #2: During each year of the charter term, the number of students who meet or exceed in Science will meet or exceed state averages in all grade levels and increase by a minimum of 1% on the Georgia Milestones Assessment (or other statewide accountability system).
- > Goal #3: During each year of the charter term, the percentage of graduates earning high school credits for accelerated enrollment through postsecondary options with accredited colleges/universities and/or technical schools will increase by a minimum of 1% as measured by CCRPX (or other statewide accountability system).




What are "Flexible Service Models"?





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
What will a College and Career Academy do for FCSS students?

- ✓ Increased partnerships with post-secondary institutions will allow students to receive credits through dual enrollment
- ✓ Accelerated courses such as ACCEL, Advanced Placement offerings and/or Move on When Ready will also provide students with another avenue to earn additional postsecondary credits while fulfilling high school graduation requirements.
 - ✓ Students can earn high school/graduation credits for internships completed with local businesses.
