Do you know how a caterpillar becomes a butterfly? First, butterflies lay small eggs. These eggs turn into caterpillars, and begin to eat and eat and eat! Once the caterpillar is full, he creates a chrysalis, or a special cocoon made of silk. Here, he forms quietly, until the cocoon is ready to break open. Out pops a beautiful butterfly!



Paper mache is pretty easy once you get the hang of it. First, mix equal parts of water and flour to make a paste. Next, blow up a balloon, and cuts pieces of newspaper into strips. Dip the newspaper strips into the paste, and apply to the balloon. Repeat this process several times. Last, let the balloon dry for 24 hours. Pop the balloon inside, then decorate!



Do you know how volcanos are formed? Over time, magma rises through cracks or weaknesses in the Earth's crust. This creates pressure inside the Earth. When the pressure is released, it causes magma to explode to the surface causing a volcanic eruption. Last, the lava from the eruption cools to form new crust.

LAST STEP

Picking the right watermelon at the store can be tricky. First, pick it up. A watermelon should feel heavy for its size. Next, look for the yellow spot. Watermelons develop a spot where they rest on the ground. When this spot is light yellow, it's ripe. Last, tap the underbelly of the watermelon. A ripe one will have a deep hollow sound, not dull.



When properly setting a table, first, lay a placemat on the table, and put a plate in the middle. Next, arrange a napkin to the left of the plate, and put a fork on top. Last, to the right of the plate, put the knife, blade pointing in. Place the spoon to the right of the knife. Now you know the basic table setting rules!

There are 3 important steps in the recycling process. First, recyclable materials are sorted and processed at a center. Last, rinse the shampoo well under warm water, until you no longer see suds or feel a residue.



My mom plans meals each Sunday for the rest of the week. First, she browses the grocery ads for sales on meat and produce. Next, she makes a list of dinner ideas for each day of the week, with a separate list of all ingredients she will need for the meals. Last, she finalizes her list, grabs her coupons, and heads out to complete the shopping.

There are 3 easy steps to protecting your home from an intruder. First, install outside security cameras and a good alarm system. Next, replace burned out bulbs on outside lights and posts. Last, start a neighborhood watch group in your community. Your local police department can help you if you call them and request information.




When you sew a button on a shirt, first, you will need to thread a needle, and bring it up through the wrong side of the fabric, in one hole of the button. Next, bring the needle back down through an opposite hole, and repeat several times. Last, secure knot by passing the needle straight through the stitches on the wrong side of the fabric to form a loop, then tie into knot.



To plan a surprise party, you must first decide who you want to invite. Think about friends or family of the guest of honor. Next, go to the store and buy snacks, like chips or cookies. Don't forget the birthday cake! Finally, decorate the party area with streamers or balloons, and turn down the lights, so you can surprise the birthday boy or girl when they arrive!



My friends and I make slime at sleepovers. First, pour 5oz of glue into a bowl. Next, add 1/2 tablespoon of baking soda, and 1 tablespoon of contact lens solution. Mix until it begins to harden. Last, knead the slime with both hands until it's the perfect consistency. Store in an airtight container to prevent the slime from drying out or spilling onto the carpet.



To grow a flower on your windowsill, first, you need to buy paper cups, dirt, and flower seeds. Next, fill one of the paper cups half way with dirt, using a shovel. Push 1 or 2 seeds down into the dirt with your finger, and cover. Last, place the cup near a sunny window, and water it a little every day. In no time, you will see the seed sprout up through the dirt and begin to grow.



Wet snow is the best for making a snowman. First, form a small snowball in your hands. Next, roll it on the ground, so that it picks up more snow, and becomes larger. Repeat this step 2 more times, making each snowball a little smaller than the first. Last, stack the snowballs on top of one another, in order from largest to smallest, then decorate with a hat, carrot nose and rocks.



No one likes soggy noodles! To make perfect spaghetti, first, you must bring a large pot of water to a rolling boil. Add a pinch of salt, and 2 tablespoons of olive oil. Next, add the dry spaghetti to the water, and cook for 10 minutes. Make sure every noodle is covered with water. Last, drain the spaghetti into a colander. Scoop the noodles into bowls, then add your favorite sauce.



Mom and I like to gather leaves, and press them to make pretty crafts. First, go on a nature walk in early fall, and collect pretty leaves and flowers. Next, gather 3 large, heavy books. Place the leaves between the pages of 1, and put the heaviest 2 on top. Last, wait 3 days, then gently remove the leaves. Put them in frames, or between sheets of contact paper for display.



There are 3 steps to choosing the perfect pair of glasses. First, look at the shape of your face. Is your face round, square or oval? Choose frames that are the opposite shape as your face. Next, match the frame color to your skin tone. Do you look better in cool or warm tones? Last, think about your lifestyle. Do you play sports, spend a lot of time on the computer, or drive at night?
