Students learned how to use the various tools it has to offer, and strategies for doing their best on that type of assessment. Our students also completed an assessment with Mrs. Mittge that focused on not just "what you know", but also on "how you know it", as a method of identifying hi-cap learners. Overall our Fabulous Fourth Graders worked very hard this week, and should be congratulated for a job well done!

Next week we will be having our 4th Grade specific in class **Spelling Bee on Friday June 4th** in the afternoon. Last week the students all received their lists of words to study connected to our spelling curriculum. Please remind them to practice spelling these outloud and writing them out, and offer any help you can. They have been working very hard on spelling and vocabulary this year, and the "buzz" around the school is that this should potentially be an exciting and close contest since we have many students who have done well in their weekly spelling tests throughout the year. We will also be having an in class End of the Year Awards Program the following week on Thursday June 10th, where we will recognize their accomplishments, so watch for more information regarding that event in the coming weeks.



As we near the end of the year, we will be beginning to ask that items that have been checked out be returned so that they can be inventoried for next year. To that end, students who have checked out books from our 4th grade library will need to bring those back in to check in with staff.
