Principal's Message

Welcome back from the well-deserved winter break. In 2021 we are moving forward with excellent virtual teaching and learning! There are important notes and tips related to your child's achievement that I want to share with you.

For your child to achieve and grow as much as possible, ensure he/she is:

- **Attending all online sessions each day.**
 - Be sure the child-care provider has a copy of your child's daily school schedule.
- **Completing and submitting all in-class assignments and all homework.**
 - If you are unsure about assignments, reach out to your child's teacher and check your child's CANVAS page.
- **Completing and submitting all tests on the dates they are scheduled.**
 - Check with your child's teacher if you are unsure about tests.
 - Check for text messages from the teacher and check your child's CANVAS page.
 - Check Active Parent for the test grades.
- **Returning to class after breaks and after lunch.**
 - Call home or the child-care provider and ask if the child is logged on.
 - Your child has morning and afternoon instruction daily.
- **Completing iReady activities.**
 - Have your child work, outside of class time, for at least 10 minutes in iReady reading and 10 minutes in iReady math each weekday for a total of 45-50 minutes in each subject per week.
- **Joining all afternoon learning sessions including the homeroom teacher's regular classroom instruction, special area teachers' classroom instruction, Ms. Butler's intervention class, Ms. Collins's literacy class, Ms. Cobb's, Ms. Brown's, and Ms. Kari's support classes.**
 - Check your child's learning schedule and CANVAS page.
 - Contact your child's teacher if you have questions about his/her schedule.

What happens when students don't login and attend classes?

- Students' learning gaps increase rather than decrease.
- Students miss guided practice and collaboration with other learners.
- Students miss quality instruction from teachers.
- Students perform at lower achievement levels when attendance is low.
- Students miss assignments resulting in poor grades.
- Students are considered absent, which leads to truancy issues.
