An interjection is a word or phrase that expresses emotion. An interjection often starts a sentence but it can be contained within a sentence or can stand alone.

Strong interjections end with exclamation points (!). Because strong interjections are followed by an end mark, the following word must be capitalized.



**DRAT!**

**What!** Boo!

Hurray!

Phew!

Woohoo!

Yay!

Good grief! Wow!

Mild interjections are separated from the rest of the sentence with commas. They may come at the beginning, middle, or end of a sentence. When coming in the middle of the sentence, two commas are needed.
