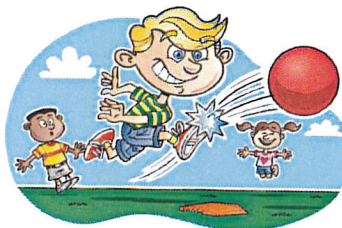


Collaborative Writing

# Fabulous Fourth Graders

Happy "Almost-End-Of-The-School-Year-Finally!" - or so the fabulous fourth graders have been telling me all week long. We have been working quickly through our current units in ELA and Math, while also beginning some of our end of the year activities, such as creating our Summer Bucket Lists in Art. Next week we plan to continue with a mixture of both fun activities and regular learning, including a fun readers theater activity based on Greek mythology, which should be **"Llamazing"!!** Our class made 3 specific learning goals this year, the **first** was to increase their reading fluency, which last week's testing



proved that they all did. Please encourage your student to keep up their reading level by reading 20-30 minutes each day through the summer - this will make a big difference for when they start 5th grade in the fall. The **second** one was to learn cursive which they have been working on during 2nd semester, and their daily practice sheets prove they are doing super with that, even though they do not all "love" to write in cursive. Their **third** goal was to improve their spelling, as they all scored relatively low in that area at the start of the school year. I am pleased to say that not only have they all made substantial improvements in this learning area, but they also all participated in a 4th grade Spelling Bee today, and **Freyman Gonzalez** was today's champion Speller! Way to Go Everyone!!!
