The Hadley-Luzerne Central School District is located in the foothills of the Adirondacks, in parts of Saratoga and Warren Counties, in Upstate New York. Covering approximately 240 square miles in six townships, the district serves a rural population of 6500, many of whom commute to Glens Falls, Saratoga, and the Capital District for employment and services. The paper industry is a key factor in the local economy with many residents working in mills or performing supply and support roles. Noted for its natural beauty and picturesque settings, the area supports significant tourism throughout the year. The Hudson River, the Great Sacandaga Lake, and numerous other small lakes and waterways, in conjunction with the Adirondacks, help define a rich local heritage whose origins predate the American Revolution.

Technology is an increasingly important element within the high school curriculum. Two full spectrum computer technology labs and internet access throughout the facility provide ample incentive for teachers and students to incorporate modern methods and solutions in their work.
