What is an E-SPLOST?

- ★ An Education Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax is a one-cent sales tax that lasts a maximum of 5 years or until the established cap is reached.
- \star It would be a continuation of the current sales tax.
- It is not a tax increase, not an additional tax, and not a property tax.
- ★ It is an equitable tax shared by *all* who make purchases in Houston County, including numerous visitors.
- It is a way to fund educational improvements that everyone contributes to, not just property owners.





What is an E-SPLOST?

- ★ By law, E-SPLOST funds must be used for capital projects for educational purposes or to make payments on bonds, but not for operating expenses, such as salaries.
- Houston County voters have approved 5 E-SPLOST votes: 1997-2001, 2002-2007, 2007-2012, 2012-2017 and 2017-2022.
- ★ The current E-SPLOST expires March 31, 2022.
- The referendum asks to continue the E-SPLOST for 5 years or until a cap of \$190 million is reached.





Success of Past E-SPLOSTs

 \star Every school in the district has been improved.

★ Since 2002, E-SPLOST funds have added a total of 1,916,344 square feet and 900 classrooms, in addition to renovation of more than 1,042,178 square feet of instructional space.

During the 2017-2022 E-SPLOST, safety has been enhanced, facility needs addressed, and improvements made in technology and transportation.





Current 2017-2022 E-SPLOST

Safety & Security – all schools benefited

- Security systems, to include cameras, upgraded across district
- **★**Access control upgraded district-wide
- ★Fire protection equipment replaced at all sites
- ★Perimeter fencing installed
- ★ Parking and traffic flow improvements at 12 schools
- **Transportation** district-wide benefit
- ★Purchase of 69 school buses

- ★Built Bonaire Primary School
- \star New competition gyms at Houston County High, Northside High, Perry High and Warner Robins High \star Multipurpose athletic facility addition at Veterans High Classroom addition at Northside High and Veterans High \star Auditorium renovations at Houston County High, Northside High, Perry High and Warner Robins High Renovated Perry High's Herb St. John Stadium **Canning** plant renovation \star HVAC upgrades at 9 sites

 Computer workstations for teachers
 Interactive panels for classrooms and media centers
 Media center touch panel self check-out stations
 Upgraded network cabling in several schools

Safety & Security

All schools will benefit.

- ★ Parking and traffic flow improvements
- ★ Sidewalk canopies replaced
- ★ Security alarm and camera upgrades
- ★ Perimeter security fencing
- ★ Exterior breezeways enclosed
- ★ Fire alarm maintenance











Facilities Today

★ 39 campuses with 4,408,707 square feet

- ★ 10 support facilities with 371,020 square feet
- ★ Average age of buildings 38 years old
- ✓ Used by approximately 30,000 students and ~4,300 fulltime employees
- ★ Extensive use of facilities requires great amount of maintenance
- As buildings age, cost and ability to maintain becomes too costly, resulting in need to renovate



Facilities Plan

Build new middle school to relieve Bonaire
 MS and Perry MS

★ Build two new elementary/primary schools to relieve Langston Road ES and Matt Arthur ES

- ★ Build new Performing Arts Center near Freedom Field
- Classroom additions based on growth
- ★ HVAC upgrades at schools
- Renovations, such as lighting, flooring, paint and roofing, at majority of campuses





Technology

All schools will benefit.

- Support teaching and learning by providing quality digital resources.
- Upgrade internet infrastructure, e.g., bandwidth, WiFi, and access points.
- ★ Continuously refresh, replace and upgrade existing classroom technology, to include hardware and software.





Transportation

Entire district would benefit.

Need more school buses to safely and adequately transport students

- ★ Average age of buses: 12.6 years
 ★ 59% of buses over 10 years old
 ★ 50% of buses over 15 years old
- **★** Buses driven more than 3 million miles a year
- **★** Demand increases as student population increases
- ★ Local district pays 88% of cost of transportation



Early Voting Feb. 22 – Mar. 12

★ Must be registered to vote by Feb. 16, 2021

★ Early voting **Feb. 22 – Mar. 12, 2021**



- ★ Early voting offered at 3 locations, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
 - ★ Board of Elections Office, Perry
 - Houston Health Pavilion Conference Center, Warner Robins
 - ★Central Georgia Technical College, Roy H. "Sonny" Watson Health Sciences Building, Warner Robins



Warner Robins Residents

The City of Warner Robins also has a special election on Mar. 16, 2021.

★ Anyone may vote early Feb. 22 – Mar. 12 at any of the 3 locations. City of Warner Robins voters will be able to vote in both special elections at the same location, but on different ballots.

★ On Election Day, Mar. 16, some City of Warner Robins voters will be able to cast both County and City ballots at one location, while a small percentage of City voters will need to visit two locations.
