### Important, Back-To-School In-Person Info

September 30, 2020

Dear Dawson Springs Schools Parents/Guardians and Stakeholders,

I am sure you have many questions regarding our in-person return to school for those who chose to do that. In addition to what you may have already received from school, below you will find information related to our daily processes. We will begin with an orientation day on Monday, October 5<sup>th</sup>, for our purple rotation group and Tuesday, October 6<sup>th</sup>, for our gold rotation group. Beginning Monday, October 12<sup>th</sup>, our purple group will be going on Monday's and Tuesday's and our gold group will be going on Thursday's and Friday's. Every Wednesday, and days they are not on campus, will be a virtual/remote day for students. If a student is unaware what rotation group they are in, please contact school. Students who chose to remain on virtual/remote will continue in that working remotely.

#### Before School Daily

Every day each parent/guardian must speak with their child(ren) and verify that they are not feeling poorly, running a temperature, coughing, etc., before they send them off to school. If the child has any symptoms of illness or COVID19 they should not send their child to school. If there is any question, we encourage families to err on the side of caution and keep the student home for the health and safety of their child and also the health and safety of all our children and staff at school.

#### Bus Riders

Every student will have their temperature checked by an adult bus monitor prior to getting on the bus. Any student with a temperature of 100.4 or greater will have their parent /guardian contacted and have to return home immediately. All riders must wear a mask and will have assigned seats. Students will be sitting one rider per seat.

#### Arriving at School

Elementary students who are car riders and walkers will use the front doors to the elementary. Jr/Sr High students who are walkers, car riders or drivers will enter through the Jr/Sr High front lobby. Prior to or immediately upon entering the building, all students will have their temperature checked. Any student that has a temperature of 100.4 or greater will not be allowed to stay at school. Breakfast will be available at the entrances for pick up, and students will proceed directly to their first period or homeroom class depending on the school protocol.

#### Face Coverings

Face coverings must be worn at all times when inside school buildings and while using school transportation. We will encourage teachers to have kids work outside some and take breaks when weather cooperates so everyone can get a break from masks. Rare exceptions may be made on masks after each individual student remits the detailed medical questionnaire that must be filled out by their doctor. This questionnaire is available at school site or the Board office.

#### Meals/M meal Pick-Up

Listed below are the locations and times meals will still be available. Although our times have changed, you can still pick up meals at these locations on the days your child(ren) are NOT on campus. At this time, with us still being under extended summer meal regulations, meals can also be served to any child that is 18 years of age or younger regardless of if they are in school or not.

Students on campus will be able to eat lunch in the cafeteria and surrounding areas as specified with appropriate spacing and protocols as developed by each school.

#### Day-to-Day Procedures

**Lockers** – Due to contact concerns, students will not be using lockers. Supplies must be carried in a backpack.

**Water fountains** – Fountains will not be in use during this time. Students may bring their own water bottle to use throughout the day. Water bottles must have a “screw on” lid.

**Visitors/ Lunch Period Drop-offs** – Visitors to the building will be limited this year, including during the lunch periods. Visitors should only come to school for school related business and are encouraged to call ahead of time.

#### Expectations for In-Person Learners

- **Students should be prepared and make sure their Chromebook is fully charged before school.**
- Follow Safety Protocols – Wear face coverings at all times – unless you are eating. Use hand sanitizer. Wash your hands frequently. Practice social distancing.
- Bring textbooks and/or workbooks and complete all assigned tasks.
- Stay on track on days you are not in-person and work to get caught up if you fall behind. Even though you may be on campus 2 days a week you should still have significant work to do at home on the other 3 days.

#### Dismissal

Upon dismissal for the day, all students will exit their respective building in a modified fashion from how we have in the past. They will be using procedures developed by each school that minimizes student contact and congregating will not be allowed. Schools will notify parents of the appropriate procedures.

#### Parent/Guardian Expectations

Parents, we will work with you to keep everyone safe but we need your help. We need you to be sure you do the following daily:

\*Verify your child is not sick or running a temperature every morning. If they are, do not send them to school.

\*If your child is sick, we encourage you to take them to a doctor for diagnosis.

\*Contact the school if your child or anyone else in your household contracts COVID19 OR if anyone in the household has to go on quarantine due to potential exposure.

\*Should a child have a temperature they cannot return to school until they are fever/symptom free for 24 hours without using temperature reducing medications (such as Tylenol, etc.).

#### COVID19 - What the District will do – We are committed to transparency

Our district will be working with the Hopkins County Health Department for all contact tracing. The Health Department will also do all related calling and notifications related to the process unless they notify us to contact specific classes or groups. Also, for transparency, in order to keep parents and stakeholders updated on the number of COVID19 cases and quarantines in our schools, we will be posting the numbers daily for students and staff as mandated on the state school repository that can be found online at this link:

Also, for health and safety, we will follow the guidelines as set forth by the Kentucky Department of Public Health. If Hopkins County goes into the “red,” meaning there is an elevated number of new cases in the county based on the rolling seven day average, then we will go back into full virtual/remote instruction mode as we started the school year. A “red” status would also “pause” all athletics until we came out of that status. We would resume in-person instruction and athletics again as it was safe to do so. Dear Dawson Springs Panther Parents, Guardians, and Stakeholders,

You have probably already heard, in keeping on track with our prior plan, on Monday our Board of Education approved us returning to in-person instruction on a rotation basis. Beginning Monday, October 12<sup>th</sup>, for those who choose to return in-person, we plan on returning on an A/B (purple/gold) rotation. After getting back on a rotation, we hope to move towards being in session 5 days a week when it's safe to do so. There will still be a total virtual/remote option for families who would prefer to continue that. An example of our rotation will be that the A/purple group will be in-person each Monday and Tuesday and the B/gold group will be in-person each Thursday and Friday. On school days when students are not in-person, they will continue working daily virtually/remotely. Each Wednesday will be an on-site virtual instruction/planning day for school staff with deep cleaning on our campus. Deep cleaning will also be done on Friday/weekends.

Please note, once students who choose to return in-person are placed in either the purple or gold rotation groups, we will have a **TOTALLY OPTIONAL orientation/soft opening day on Monday, October 5<sup>th</sup> for the purple group and Tuesday, October 6<sup>th</sup> for the gold group.** These two days will be ran just as we plan to run a regular school day with buses, meals, etc. Our staff is working diligently on plans, protocols, and procedures and this information will be shared in the coming days as we finalize them. Rotation groups will be assigned based on households, student and class needs and other distancing factors.

Based on our prior planning and what has been shared before, for planning and logistical purposes, for those who have not been contacted recently, we will be making contacts in the coming days to every household to get commitments from parents/guardians regarding their child(ren) returning to school either in-person or staying on virtual/remote learning. One critical piece to this is that all who choose to return in-person must agree to the requirements as set forth when we return, such as wearing a mask, social distancing, temperature checks, etc. If a student/family is unable or unwilling to follow the requirements as set forth, then, for the safety of all our students and staff, they would be better served choosing and staying on virtual/remote instruction. Please contact the building Principal where your child attends if you have any questions on this.

I would again like to caution folks over the coming weeks, in preparation for our potential in-person return, staying healthy at home or close to home and avoiding traveling to areas with high COVID19 numbers is important. Also, wearing masks in public is essential for us to get back in school and to stay in school, even though some may question it or not agree with it. At this time, based on the most current recommendations from our state health officials, **masks will be required at all the times for both students and staff** inside our buildings, on buses, and in school vehicles for all staff and students' grades 1-12. We do not necessarily like this, and it is a change from our prior initial planning and discussions of masks not being needed if in classrooms and socially distanced. Grade K will need masks while in areas other than when socially distanced in their classroom. This recommendation is new within the last few weeks and passed on to us from the state department of education. We will continue to make adjustments as needed and as recommendations warrant. When we return, we will encourage teachers to get students working outside as much as possible, weather permitting, so that students can appropriately distance and take a break from having to wear masks.

Lastly, as I have said many times before, our #1 priority above anything else is the health and safety of our students, staff and our families. Upon our return, we will have significant safety measures in place and will be following the most current guidance and associated protocols from our local and state health officials. We will also be transparent and report numbers for active quarantines and positive COVID19 cases daily so families can stay informed and make decisions along the way if needed. We are totally committed to maintaining a safe learning environment. Our Panther Nation is strong and resilient. As always, should you have any questions please do not hesitate to contact the office of the school your child attends, or contact my office. We are looking forward to seeing students back in our schools and appreciate your continued support of our students and our schools...more info to come.

# IN THE SPOTLIGHT



As a team, Dawson Springs finished the All-A State Tournament in 10th place with a score of 456.

Dawson Springs Girls' Golf team claimed the All-A regional title Saturday, Aug. 22, at the Hopkinsville Country Club.

Junior Maddie Huddleston led the Lady Panther golfers with a fourth-place finish with a score of 94. She was followed by Junior Brylee Spurlin with a 134, Sophomore Natalee Oldham with a 136, and Freshman Maddie Back with a 187.

With the win, the Lady Panther team qualified for the All-A Classic Girls' Golf State Tournament on Saturday, Sept. 12 at the Arlington Club in Richmond.

Maddie Huddleston recorded her best-ever finish at the All-A State Tournament with a 32nd place finish. The Dawson Springs junior carded an 89 when she went out with a 44 and recorded three pars on the back nine to come in with a 45. Natalee Oldham finished in 71st with a round of 117 followed by Maddie Back and Brylee Spurlin who tied for 75th with a 125.

Gage Smiley took first place honors at the All-A Classic Boys' Regional Golf Tournament at the Hopkinsville Country Club on Saturday, Aug. 22.

Despite a prior delay for heavy rain, Gage, a sophomore, shot a 40 on the front nine in light rain and came in with a 41 on the back nine. Senior Carlton McCuiston shot a 95, followed by Junior Addison Whalen with a 96, Sophomore Greyson Brewer with a 98, and 8th Grader Kolby Crook with a 118.

The Panther team finished the tournament as Regional runner-up.

Gage's first place finish qualified him to advance to the All-A Classic State Tournament at Gibson Bay Golf Course in Richmond rescheduled for Friday, Sept. 25.

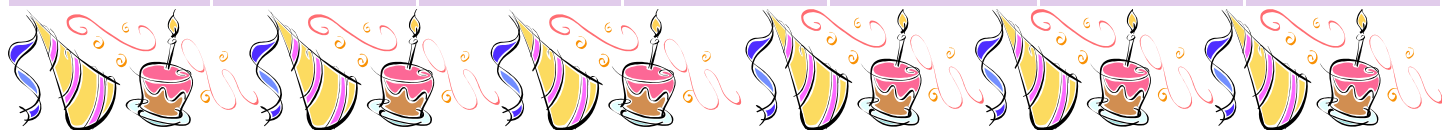

*Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program*

**Y**our child may qualify for free or low-cost health insurance through the Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program (KCHIP).

KCHIP is for children younger than 19 years old whose family meets certain income guidelines. Families who qualify are usually in the middle to low income range.

Children enrolled in KCHIP are covered for:

- doctors' visits
- hospital stays and emergency services
- mental health services
- lab tests and X-rays
- prescription drugs
- immunizations
- speech therapy
- health screenings
- dental, hearing and eye checkups

Applying is easy. A face-to-face interview is not required. To apply for KCHIP:

- request an application by phone by calling toll-free (877) KCHIP-18
- print a mail-in application online at [kidshealth.ky.gov](http://kidshealth.ky.gov)
- apply in person at your local Community Based Services office

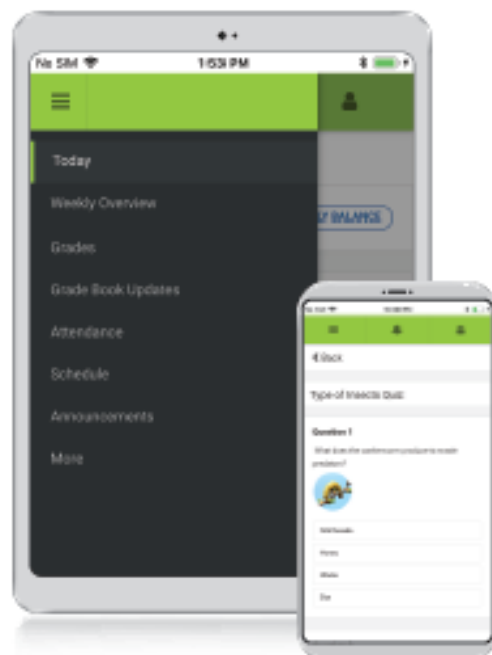
