Free CHOICE in Reading...



Do your children to read? Many say they do not. When at home, encourage and allow your children to have a choice in the books they want to read. With so many required passages for students to read at school, it is so important that students are given the opportunity to choose books they will like - some easy, some just right, some too difficult. But <u>choice</u> makes students want to read more successfully.

- When students get to make genuine choices about their reading material, it increases the likelihood they engage more in reading, and increases their effort and commitment to reading.
- Research shows students who read independently become better readers, score higher on achievement tests in all subject areas, and have greater content knowledge than those who do not. The amount of free reading done outside of school has also consistently been found to relate to growth in vocabulary, reading comprehension, verbal fluency and general information.
- 3. Very few children say they enjoy reading, and those numbers decrease as they age. A recent National Literacy Trust study found just 15.6 percent of teens age 14-16 say they enjoy reading. Independent reading and free choice helps students discover the fun, adventure and pleasure in reading. Roughly 80 percent of children said the book they liked most was one they had selected on their own.

Please know that our teachers and staff are working diligently to instruct your child based on their strengths and needs, with input from their STAR assessment and classroom academic performance. Our teachers are continually looking for new ideas and consistently change tactics and strategies to make certain our students are engaged during classroom instruction. If a student is Hybrid, please make sure they have their camera on and are engaged in the lesson. If not, they will be placed in the Waiting Room. Students should also be submitting assignments daily.

Parent-Teacher Conferences will be held February 1st-5th. Your child(ren)'s teacher will send a REMIND message for scheduling your conference. Please make plans to attend the ZOOM conference, since it will give you the opportunity to talk about your child's progress.

Attendance counts... Attendance directly impacts academic achievement. State law requires students to attend 90% of all school days for promotion. Attendance Conferences will start soon with Guidance Counselors. If your child(ren) have three (3) consecutive or five (5) unexcused days absent, you will receive an Attendance Letter from our Attendance Clerk. Either medical excuses or up to 10 handwritten letters can be submitted by a parent.

When your child(ren) leave the house in the morning, please make sure they have their mask, water bottle, and instructional material. Safety is our top priority at WMES, and we appreciate all of your support!
