At the May Board of Education meeting on May 21, 2019 this project was discussed as a possible end of year project from our projected fiscal year-end balance, specifically to rehabilitate the HPS Cafeteria Floor. This year-end project also appears on the Purchase Resolution to be discussed at the Operations Sub-Committee meeting following this Facilities Sub-Committee meeting. Final approval of this project, to be done by Fuss & O'Neil, will be granted or declined when the Board votes on the Purchase Resolution at the full meeting on June 18, 2019. Work will start after school is dismissed and conclude before June 30, 2019. The cost of the project is not to exceed \$25,585 and will not need to be bid as Fuss & O'Neil has a contract with the State to perform this type of AHERA service.

Two clauses were cited in the 2018-2019 End of Year Projects memo that myself and Sandra Sullivan, the Director of Food and Nutrition Services, used in our conclusion that these costs cannot be borne by Food Services. The Board asked specifically for us to contact the Connecticut State Department of Education (CSDE) regarding the use of the non-profit school food service account (NPSFSA) operating in the New Milford Public Schools to absorb some of the costs for the proposed HPS Cafeteria Floor replacement. They concluded, as we did, that this would not be an allowable cost for the NPSFSA to assume. A copy of this correspondence is on the rear of this memo.

We are recommending that the Board proceed with approving this project to come from the projected fiscal year-end balance with an amount not to exceed \$25,585. Final approval of this project, to be done by Fuss & O'Neil, will be granted or rejected when the Board votes on the Purchase Resolution at the full meeting on June 18, 2019.

Dear Sandy,

Since my colleague, Fionnuala Brown, is out of the office she asked me to get back to you regarding your email inquiring if whether it is allowable for the non-profit school food service account (NPSFSA) operating in the New Milford Public Schools to pay for floor replacement as outlined in your email. In addition to referring to the *Indirect Costs Guidance for State Agencies & School Food Authorities*, I conferred with my colleagues with expertise in the USDA regulations concerning both procurement and school meals operations to confirm the correct response.

We all agree that based on USDA guidance this would NOT be an allowable cost for the NPSFSA to assume.

As you know, the New Milford NPSFSA has previously submitted a plan to use some excess funds that have been accrued by the NPSFSA. This plan is already approved by our office. The use of funds in this plan were all directly related to the food service operation and improvement of meal service for New Milford students.
