Reading Tips for Parents

An important part of teaching literacy is to provide daily opportunities for students to read books, on their own, at their independent level. Through independent reading, students: develop fluency; develop an interest in favorite books, topics, authors, series, and types of text; develop the habit of reading and become absorbed in books; learn about themselves as readers; develop reading stamina and read for increasingly longer periods of time; and put into practice the reading skills and strategies that have been taught.

How can I support reading at home?

- Read aloud to your child daily.
- Encourage daily independent reading.
- Visit libraries and bookstores.
- Find books that interest your child.
- Enhance your child's vocabulary with stimulating conversation.
- Establish a special place for books at home.
- Show that reading is important and enjoyable.
- Let your child see you reading.
