Student Services: Non-Traditional

Alyssa Rochelle is making a difference in the automotive safety class at the Greenville Technical Center. She is a first year student who attends Riverside High School. She is rotating tires on a car during this lab period. By participating in this program she is increasing awareness of gender bias and stereotyping and eliminating the stigma of limited careers for females. Non-traditional jobs generally pay females 20-30% more than traditionally female jobs, meaning that women in nontraditional fields will earn 150% more over the course of their careers. Receiving training in a non-traditional field opens new opportunities including high-wage management and business ownership.

Would you recommend GTC to other students?

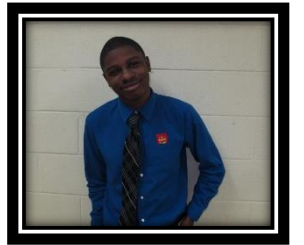
