## Bulletin column December 01, 2019 "From the Pastor"

Dear parishioners,

Happy New Year! For us as Catholics, the First Sunday of Advent is our "New Year's Day" of the new liturgical Church year. We prepare to celebrate the beginnings of our distinct Christian faith with the birth of Jesus at Christmas. The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines Advent in these terms: "When the Church celebrates the liturgy of Advent each year, she makes present this ancient expectancy of the Messiah, for by sharing in the long preparation for the Savior's first coming, the faithful renew their ardent desire for the second coming."

The term "making present" in that quote from the catechism references the Greek word "anamnesis," the same word Jesus uses in the Greek rendition of His words at the Last Supper to institute the Eucharist: "Do this in memory (anamnesis) of Me." This isn't memory in the sense of just remembering some detail as if we were playing a matching game, but rather bringing something from the past into our current reality in a profound way. It's like a very deep sense of déjà vu. In the context of faith, it involves a ritual reenactment of past events in such a way that they become present to us in a way that has a deep impact on us today.

Whenever we celebrate the Eucharist, then, Jesus' past acts of the Paschal Mystery (His suffering, death, and resurrection) and in fact His very personal presence (after all, He says "in memory of Me") are made present to us in the context of our liturgy. Whenever we celebrate Advent liturgically, with our "countdown candles," our violet vestments, and especially our readings that reflect both the Jewish people's anticipation of Jesus' coming and the prophecy and promise of His future coming in the fullness of time, we have the Jewish people's wait for the coming of the Messiah made present to us in a way that is meant not only to prepare us for Christmas, but also to help us prepare for Jesus' second coming.

We enter our new Church year with a new cycle of readings, this time Year A which features Gospel readings from the Gospel of St. Matthew. While St. Luke, who was the source of readings for last year's Year C cycle, focuses on Jesus' focus on the poor, women, and outsiders, St. Matthew shows Jesus as the Great Rabbi, the teacher who gives the Law of the New Covenant while fulfilling the Old Covenant. He shows how Jesus fulfills the Messianic prophecies even as He both confounds and exceeds all of their expectations.

Jews in Jesus' time were waiting for the Messiah, the descendant of David who would bring about the new kingdom of God, but were also waiting for a distinct figure, the Son of Man, a powerful superhuman figure who would bring about the end of the world and judge the living and the dead. Jesus, of course, is both the Messiah and the Son of Man. He has come as Messiah to enact the kingly sacri-

fice of giving His life for His people and for all people as well as to plant the seeds of His endless kingdom in the hearts of those who believe in Him. However, He will also come again in glory to judge the living and the dead at the time when that kingdom will be brought about in its fullness.

Jesus warns us in the Gospel to be watchful and ready for His second coming, for we know not the day nor the hour. Advent calls upon us to prepare our hearts for the full coming of that kingdom. As always, we remember that it is even more likely that Jesus will "come for us" rather than His coming happening in our lifetimes, and that the urgency is the same. In our second reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Romans, he enjoins us "to awake from sleep," to be ready for the coming of Christ by "throwing off the works of darkness and putting on the armor of light." If Lent has to do with repentance, Advent has to do with progressive conversion. What changes do we need to make in our lives in order to be ready for Christ's second coming (or at least His coming for us at the end of our lives)? It is good to engage in some light resolutions of penance during Advent in order to gain greater freedom to live in God's grace.

Another good Advent practice is to get to confession. We will have a parish penance service on Monday, December 16<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 pm. In the meantime, I would like to remind people of our usual confession schedule – Monday through Friday 7:30-8:00 am (or 7:45-8:10 am if I happen to have the Mass), Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays 5:30-5:50 pm, Wednesdays 5:00-5:20 pm, and Saturdays 3:45-4:45 pm and 6:15-6:50 pm. My intention is that both Fr. Mike and I will be present for virtually all of these times. Someone brought it to my attention that several parishioners believe that it isn't allowed to come to confession in English prior to a Spanish Mass. Nothing could be further from the truth! Fr. Mike, of course, is still, at this time, only able to hear confessions in English, while I am always willing to hear a confession in English. I do begin the confession in Spanish if it's prior to a Spanish Mass, but all you have to do in that event if you want to confess in English is say, "Father, this one's in English," or "I'd like to confess in English," and we will proceed accordingly.

While our bookkeeper, Mrs. Jeannie Mahaney, has not yet made her report on the collections from last week due to the shortened holiday week, people tell me that the delay of the capital campaign and call for increased Sunday giving was received with understanding. I have high hopes that our collections will increase in such a way as to bring us back to a healthy operational situation, and heartily thank all parishioners for their generous response. I pray that the coming Church year will be a blessed and glorious one for the people of St. Michael Church!

## Bulletin column December 01, 2019 "From the Pastor" Continued

This time of year also brings us into our novena in preparation for the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. I would invite everyone to examine the schedule for the novena in the bulletin and plan to attend. This year features a bit of a change to our usual December schedule of things because I will be gone during the weekend of Dec. 6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> to present at the Spanish-language Worldwide Marriage Encounter weekend in Bellevue. For that reason, 1) our Guadalupe festival will be moved from the 8<sup>th</sup>, when we would usually schedule it, to the 15<sup>th</sup>. We ask all to plan to attend this great event. 2) Furthermore, the Vigil of the Two Hearts will take place as usual the late evening of Friday the 6<sup>th</sup>, but Fr. Mike will be manning the fort alone, which means that the Masses will be at the low altar facing the people, the opening Mass will be in English rather than Latin, and Fr. Mike will be alone for confessions, which will be exclusively in English.

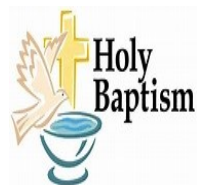
I would invite all parishioners to attend our quarterly meeting this Sunday afternoon, the 1<sup>st</sup>, at 3 pm. This will be our first combined meeting in which the meeting will be conducted bilingually with speakers of both languages present. The various groups of the parish will have the opportunity to present themselves again, and we plan to have a discussion about an important matter – the consideration of whether to change our Wednesday, 5:30 pm Mass from English to Spanish. The reasoning behind this decision would be because the gargantuan majority of people who attend this Mass are parishioners who are largely only understand and speak Spanish, and that even more of these would be likely to attend it if it were in Spanish. The arguments against it would be the concerns of many English speakers of a feeling that "someday all of the Masses will be in Spanish," which is untrue, but is a real perception and concern, and also the proposition of some faith formation development proposals in English which would be facilitated by the presence of that English Mass and would likely draw in many more English speakers. What are your thoughts? Come and share them!

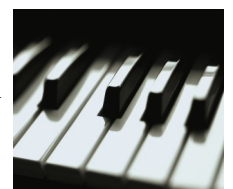

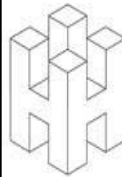
