RANDOLPH COUNTY — With a four-vear contract extension that is the longest allowable by state law, the Randolph County Board of Education gave its superintendent a profound vote of confidence in September.

Gary Cook, chairman of the Randolph County Board of Education, announced the decision by the board at its September meeting to approve a lengthy commitment to Randolph County Schools Superintendent Stephen Gainey.
