MRS. YOUNG KINDERGARTEN AND 1ST GRADE


Hello parents!

Hello Families,

This week students have been working hard on learning the concept of multiplication. They have now taken their first test and will be moving on from the concept of multiplication to learning and memorizing the facts. It will be extremely important that you help your child memorize their facts at home. This doesn't need to be anything structured, something as simple as asking your child math facts in the car or while you are cooking dinner is perfect just pick a time that works for your family. When starting out your child will likely still need to draw a picture or skip count until they are able to memorize the fact, a small whiteboard works great for this!

This was an exciting week in ELA, students worked on researching and writing a 4 to 5 paragraph paper on an animal of their choosing. Students learned all sorts of fun facts including that an Ostrich can run up to 40 miles per hour and a Moose can eat up to 70 pounds of food in one day! Students will be typing their final drafts at home. Your student will hopefully remember from last year but that was a long time ago so if they need a reminder just let me know. This was the third graders first attempt at a real essay and they did an amazing job. Make sure to read yours with your child and tell them how proud you are of their hard work.

With the rainy weather came the opportunity to play in the bus garage with scooters, fun was had by all!

<u>Super Second Grade Weekly Update: 11/20/20</u>

Second grade students have been thinking a lot about thankfulness and gratitude this month. With that theme in mind, our growth mindset mantra this week was, "Feedback is a gift, accept it."

During our Zoom meetings and embedded into our online SEL Google Classroom lessons we have been discussing the two main components of feedback. The first is providing feedback. The second is receiving feedback.

As valued members of a learning community each student will have opportunities to both provide and receive meaningful feedback. We want the intent of these exchanges to be positive and enriching so we can learn and grow every day.

Students and I will be using "THiNK" to establish positive, working relationships with one another. "T" is for "True;" is what I am about to say helpful? "N" is for "Necessary;" does what I am about to say need to be said? "K" is for "Kind;" is what I am about to say kind? If we answer no to any of these questions we should probably re"THiNK" our feedback.

We can also use "THiNK" to receive feedback. By encouraging students to "THiNK" before they speak, we can encourage them to **act** appropriately rather than **react**.

On Tuesday, Nov. 24th second graders will be doing something a little different during their usual 9:00 am Zoom session. They will have the option of sharing a Thanksgiving themed song, poem, piece of art, or their Pilgrim Pocketbook. Students will need to have their piece to showcase prepared and ready to share in under two minutes. Please practice these pieces this weekend.


