# Memorandum of Understanding Regarding the Planning and Implementation of Emergency Mass Vaccination and/or Dispensing Countermeasures

WHEREAS efforts to plan for and protect the civilian population of our state from public health emergencies has become an important public policy; and

WHEREAS the Connecticut Department of Public Health has developed a strategy to implement countermeasures in the event a need to vaccinate and/or dispense medications to the population in a short period of time arises; and

WHEREAS the Town of New Milford and the New Milford Health Department ("NMHD") are the lead agencies to develop plans for a mass vaccination and/or medication dispensing clinic, which are designated by the Connecticut Department of Public Health as Region #8 consisting of the towns of New Fairfield, New Milford, Sherman and Washington; and

WHEREAS the Town of New Milford and the NMHD must prepare and develop plans for the establishment and operation of a mass vaccination and/or a medication dispensing clinic for Region #8, the Town of New Milford (NMHD) and the New Milford BOE, Department of Food Nutrition Services wish to formalize their relationship for this purpose.

#### NOW THEREFORE BE IT AGREED BY THE PARTIES THAT:

- 1. NMHD will be responsible for all issues related to preparation and development of the plans for the establishment of the location, transportation, security, volunteer recruitment and operation of the mass vaccination and/or dispensing clinic and shall bear the cost for developing these plans.
- 2. BOE agrees that the operation of the clinic may be conducted at the New Milford High School and that transportation from other school building sites may be conducted.
- 3. The Parties understand that implementation of the plan may occur on short notice at a time when there may be a declaration of emergency (or some similar event) declared in the State of Connecticut by the Governor, the Commissioner of Public Health or other designated state authority. The Parties further understand that if the plan must be implemented during a declaration of emergency by the State of Connecticut, public school will not be in session.
- 4. The Parties understand that if the plan must be implemented, even with thorough planning, there may be unforeseen circumstances that arise. Accordingly, the Parties agree to work together to resolve these circumstances as events unfold in a manner consistent with protecting public health and safety.
- 5. BOE agrees that, if the plan must be implemented, the use of BOE buildings and associated equipment, such as computers, telephones, furniture and other facilities, may be available for the operation of a clinic as needed.
- 6. NMHD agrees that, if the plan must be implemented, reasonable care will be exercised in the use of BOE buildings and associated equipment and understands that separate

- understandings must be made for other components of the plan, such as food service and transportation.
- 7. The Parties agree that any changes to this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) will be jointly agreed upon, and periodic updates of planning efforts will be provided to the Superintendent of Schools for the BOE.

WHEREFORE the Parties have executed this MOU on the dates set forth herein.

# Memorandum of Understanding Regarding the Food Services for Health Department Staff & Volunteers during a Public Health Emergency

WHEREAS efforts to plan for and protect the civilian population of our state from public health emergencies has become an important public policy; and

WHEREAS the Connecticut Department of Public Health has developed a strategy to implement countermeasures in the event a need to vaccinate and/or dispense medications to the population in a short period of time arises; and

WHEREAS the Town of New Milford and the New Milford Health Department ("NMHD") are the lead agencies to develop plans for a mass vaccination and/or medication dispensing clinic, which are designated by the Connecticut Department of Public Health as Region #8 consisting of the towns of New Fairfield, New Milford, Sherman and Washington; and

WHEREAS the Town of New Milford and the NMHD may be required, under some dispensing scenarios, to provide food and beverages for the staff and volunteers ("staff") of such a clinic, the Town of New Milford (NMHD) and the New Milford Board of Education, Department of Food Nutrition Services (BOE -FNS), wish to formalize their relationship for this purpose.

#### NOW THEREFORE BE IT AGREED BY THE PARTIES THAT:

- 1. NMHD may be responsible for feeding up to 3 eight-hour shifts of staff, for an uncertain number of days, in certain mass dispensing scenarios.
- 2. BOE-FNS agrees that school cafeterias may be utilized to feed staff. Existing plans specify New Milford High School and Sarah Noble Intermediate School as the primary sites for dispensing clinics
- 3. BOE-FNS agrees that NMHD may prepare and utilize any food or beverages that are on site, or delivered during the dispensing event.
- 4. NMHD shall maintain records of use of food and beverage stocks and shall reimburse the BOE–FNS for the costs of all items utilized during such an event.
- 5. BOE–FNS Director, Sandra Sullivan, has agreed to be a contact person regarding use of kitchen facilities and food stocks, in the event they are required.
- 6. The Parties understand that implementation of the plan may occur on short notice at a time when there may be a declaration of emergency (or some similar event) declared in the State of Connecticut by the Governor, the Commissioner of Public Health or other designated state authority. The Parties further understand that if the plan must be implemented during a declaration of emergency by the State of Connecticut, public school will not be in session.
- 7. The Parties understand that if the plan must be implemented, even with thorough planning, there may be unforeseen circumstances that arise. Accordingly, the Parties agree to work together to resolve these circumstances as events unfold in a manner consistent with protecting public health and safety.
- 8. NMHD agrees that, if the plan must be implemented, reasonable care will be exercised in the use of the cafeteria space and equipment.
- 9. The Parties agree that changes to this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) will be jointly agreed upon.
