

Education Pays: Higher Educational Attainment Generally Yields Higher Weekly Earnings



On the board or document camera, complete an IVF summary sentence together:

The 2007 U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics illustrates that overall median weekly income increases based on the amount of education an individual has earned. An individual lacking a high school diploma earned \$428, the least amount of all the categories studied. An individual with a bachelor's degree earned \$987, more than double the weekly earnings of a high school drop-out. The highest degree studied, doctorate degree, earned the highest weekly wage, \$1,497.
