

Call Out for October 16, 2020

This is Richard Dennis, Superintendent of Elmore County Public Schools. I hope everyone enjoyed a short week as we begin second term; fall is in the air which means Thanksgiving and Christmas will soon be upon us.

Since last week, 5 students reported testing positive for COVID-19 and 3 employees.

Student report cards will be distributed on October 22, and school-based virtual report card distribution schedule will be communicated and posted on each school's website.

Please be reminded that students will have until October 26 to change their learning platform from virtual to traditional face-to-face school. The next available opportunity to make the transition will be at the end of first semester in December. Parents of school-based virtual students, please note that student attendance is based on participation on the virtual platform your student uses, and this process is referred to as virtual engagement. If your student does not meet virtual engagement requirements, the administration at your student's school will be in contact to provide you with the available options for the next grading term. From this point on, students that fail to meet virtual engagement requirements will be marked as absent and will be referred to the District Attorney's Helping Families Program.
