Program Ad Sales: We ask that you have a <u>Minimum \$50 in Ads</u> (¼ Page @ \$ 25.00 each, Half page \$40.00, Full Page \$60.00). Ads may be from a business, personal acquaintances, and/or family members. . **<u>Due October 12, 2018</u>^{**} Email ads to <u>Sonja.Gibson@hcbe.net</u>. Place funds in a sealed envelope with your contestant's name, grade, and homeroom on the envelope. Checks should be written to the *Miss HMS Scholarship Fund*. (Submit Ads electronically if possible along with info. of child's name and amount given for the size ad)

Signature Page Award:

Each Signature Page may contain as many legible signatures with well wishes as you like, however, you should raise a total of \$50.00 in order to count a page as submitted. At the discretion of the Board, 1/2 page Signature pages **MAY** be accepted, at the rate of \$35.00

Photogenic Award: (\$10 entry fee per photo) Choose a photo that shows her personality, best qualities, and spirit. These may be a personal or professionally taken picture. Label the picture *PHOTOGENIC, and write the contestant's* name and contestant number on the back in permanent marker. (THIS IS AN OPTIONAL AWARD CATEGORY. There is a \$10.00 Additional Fee for each photograph entered in this category. There will be 1 winner.)

People's Choice Award:

Contestants are encouraged to raise funds which translate to \$1 per vote in order to win the category of People's Choice for Miss HMS. Each contestants raising a minimum of \$100 will be eligible for a cash prize of \$25 should they receive the most "votes" in this category.

Escorts:

The Pageant Directors are asking that the father/male guardian or person of significance (no contestant boyfriends!!) of each contestant serve as an escort during the evening wear portion of the pageant. Each escort will need to be present for dress rehearsal on **Friday, November 2, 2018 at 5:15 p.m.** Also, each escort will need to arrive at the school on SATURDAY, Nov.3, no later than 6:20pm to go into Escort Holding Room. The attire for the Escort will be dress shirt and coordinating tie-jacket optional (a black suit or Military Uniform is preferred, but not required), etc.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- Students who choose to drop out of the pageant, either verbally or through their actions, will not be issued a
 refund <u>for any reason</u>.
- Inappropriate behavior or gossip/talk by or about any contestant before or during the competition is just cause for disqualification and/or removal from the pageant.
- Likewise, unseemly conduct by the family or supporters of the contestant before, during or after the pageant may also affect the score/placement of the contestant.
- A contestant who is placed in ISS with time to be served during the pageant dates or rehearsal dates cannot participate in this event and is not entitled to a refund.
- Any contestant who the director feels has missed rehearsals and does not know the routines of dances or stage placement due to attendance or lack of effort will be allowed to participate in the pageant. However, there is a possibility that she may not be permitted to have a part of the production numbers during the pageant. Students in this category will be eligible for all awards EXCEPT Miss Huntington Middle School.
- Any contestant who does not abide by the rules may be allowed to participate in the pageant, but will not be eligible to compete for the title of Miss Huntington Middle School. Should this situation arise, the parents and student will be notified prior to the announcement of the final awards.
- The decision of the Judges Panel is final. Once the Auditor's calculations and Judges' Ballots have been confirmed by the Board there is no recourse to overturn their decision. While you may have occasion to ask what area(s) were strengths or weaknesses for your child, the judges do reserve the right to keep that information confidential and not share their scores or their opinions with you. This is done to protect the integrity of the Judging process.
- If you feel that an error has been made regarding any fundraising awards only, please submit your concern AND proof of payment, and your complaint will be evaluated and addressed in a timely manner. In addition, right before the pageant starts, please do not address issues regarding a program book. This can be handled after the pageant unless minor. FUNDRAISING CATEGORIES DO NOT HAVE A DIRECT AFFECT ON THE SCORING OF THE PAGEANT.

Wardrobe Guidelines

Wardrobing for all phases of the competition should be checked for appropriateness through the HMS staff on the Wardrobe Approval Committee. Please **e-mail** pictures of outfits (contestants wearing wardrobe, front and back) to <u>talenthea.hollis@hcbe.net</u>, OR you may choose bring items after school hours for approval. Deadline for having <u>all phases</u> of wardrobe approved is **Monday**, **October 29**, **2018, by 5:00pm**.



Interview: Age Appropriate attire (i.e. a suit, 2-piece dress, church, or nice dinner outfit). Natural makeup is acceptable. <u>No formal wear or jeans</u>. Interviews will be conducted on the morning of <u>Nov. 3rd</u>. Each contestant will have an order and an assigned time for their interview. Please arrive 10 minutes prior to that time.



Opening Number Outfit: Use "Huntington's Heroes" as your theme for your inspiration. The opening number outfit should tastefully showcase your personality and sparkle, and personal style, as you represent whichever hero you choose.

- Think in terms of a pageant of <u>bling, sequins, flash, sparkle, jewels, shiny, shimmery</u> with accessories that tie it together and to bring it life.
- Judging criteria: Uniqueness, WOW Factor, and CREATIVITY.
- Keep it Classy and not sexy when putting together your costume.
- It's always appropriate to **honor** our Veterans, especially since it's Veterans Day Weekend.



Athletic/Fitness Wear: Fitness may consist of solid black or red shorts, skorts, capri fitness pants and a solid black, red, or white fitted top to show fitness and tone. Generally, the fitness outfit shows how the contestant stays physically fit; It is NOT a costume or an athletic uniform.





Talent: Attire, talent and music must be approved.

<u>Time:</u> 90 seconds (1 ¹/₂ minutes). Any music or act over the time limit will be disqualified in the Talent section. Singers and most instrumentalists should use accompaniment music (without vocal tracks). We will not provide tracks or edit music.

<u>Music Needed:</u> 3 copies labeled with name and constant number -2 CDs (1 song per CD) turned in, and a copy for you to practice with at home. Music on phones will <u>NOT</u> be accepted. NO **EXCEPTIONS.**

Diabetes Research and Awareness

Diabetes is a very serious health problem affecting thousands of families each day. There is a tremendous need to educate people about the disease and it is imperative to raise funds to increase research for finding a cure. It is my goal to bring awareness about diabetes by working with local organizations to help educate students in my community and establish fund raising activities within our school system.

I was diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes at the age of eight and it was a life-changing experience for me and my family. Since I was diagnosed, I have noticed that many of my peers have never known anyone with diabetes and many think that you can develop diabetes, just by eating too much candy. I did not know anything about the disease myself until I had to learn the hard way. I was admitted to the hospital over summer break to learn how to manage my diabetes. When I returned to school, my parents had to meet with my teachers and nurse to talk about a care plan for my condition. They also had to educate the students in my class, so they would know what to do in case of an emergency. The first year was difficult, especially since I was the only student in school that had diabetes, but I had lots of support from my friends and family, which made it easier to deal with.

I would like to implement a plan to bring diabetes awareness into each school system in my community, so every student and teacher is educated about the disease. Everyone should be given information that lists the symptoms of the disease and who to contact if there is a concern. I would really like to implement some type of screening program that would indicate who may be at risk for the disease. Many people live with diabetes and do not know it. Implementing a screening program in each school may diagnose diabetes in the early stages before organ damage occurs.

Fund raising efforts are also very important. I have done some research in this area and found that the Juvenile Research Development Foundation (JDRF) provides fundraising activities for schools in which students and the community participate in a "Walk for Diabetes" effort which benefits the school and provides money for diabetes research. The "Walk" provides money for the school to use for equipment, or field trips, and also provides education and community support, as well as providing an opportunity to get kids actively involved. Students who participate also receive incentives to promote the fundraising effort. I would like to further investigate fundraising opportunities with this organization as part of my platform efforts.

The nation needs to be made aware of the seriousness of this disease, especially if left untreated. The consequences could be deadly. The Miss America Organization provides the perfect environment for promoting this type of platform. In my opinion, and based on my personal experience, diabetes education is a must and should be taken seriously. We need a cure!
