1 STATE OF OKLAHOMA 2 2nd Session of the 55th Legislature (2016) 3 HOUSE BILL 2824 By: Denney 4 5 6 AS INTRODUCED 7 An Act relating to schools; providing definitions; directing the State Board of Education to publish a consolidation list of all elementary school 8 districts; excluding elementary school districts 9 which have received a certain exemption; allowing certain school districts to voluntarily consolidate 10 or be annexed; providing for submission of petition to the Board; establishing timeline for consolidation or annexation; providing for mandatory consolidation 11 by certain date; requiring prompt action; 12 establishing criteria for disapproval of a voluntary consolidation or annexation; providing for the 1.3 levying of certain taxes; providing for transfer of bonded indebtedness; providing for the division of 14 property; limiting construction to require the closing of a school site; limiting number of 15 superintendents; allowing consolidation or annexation of noncontiquous school districts if certain 16 conditions are met; allowing certain districts in the different counties to consolidate or annex; directing 17 the Board to promulgate rules; allowing an elementary school district to apply for an exemption from certain consolidation list; listing certain criteria; 18 stating basis for granting or denying an application; 19 providing for codification; and providing an effective date. 20 21 22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

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SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 7-301 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

As used in Sections 2 and 3 of this act:

- 1. "Affected district" means a school district that loses territory or students as a result of annexation or consolidation;
- 2. "Annexation" means the joining of an affected school district with a receiving school district;
- 3. "Consolidation" means the joining of two or more school districts to create a new single school district with one administrative unit and one board of education;
- 4. "Elementary school district" means a school district that offers an early childhood program through grade eight, kindergarten through grade eight or an early childhood program through grade six and meets the criteria established in Section 5-103 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 5. "Receiving district" means a school district or districts that receive territory or students, or both, from an affected district as a result of annexation or consolidation; and
- 6. "Resulting district" means the new school district created from an affected district or districts as a result of annexation or consolidation.

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 7-302 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

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- A. By January 31, 2017, and on January 31 every sixth year thereafter, the State Board of Education shall publish a list of all elementary school districts subject to consolidation. The consolidation list shall include all elementary school districts except for the districts which have received an exemption as provided for in Section 3 of this act.
- B. 1. Any elementary school district included in the consolidation list developed by the Board pursuant to subsection A of this section may voluntarily agree to consolidate with or be annexed to another school district or districts in accordance with the requirements and limitations of this section.
- 2. Any elementary school district on the consolidation list choosing to voluntarily consolidate or annex shall submit a petition for approval to the Board within sixty (60) days of publication of the consolidation list. The petition shall set forth the terms of the consolidation or annexation agreement.
- 3. If the petition is approved by the Board, the consolidation or annexation shall be completed by May 31 and shall be effective by July 1 of the year the consolidation list is published.
- C. An elementary school district on the consolidation list developed by the Board pursuant to subsection A of this section that

does not submit a petition under subsection B of this section or
that does not receive approval by the Board for a voluntary
consolidation or annexation petition shall be consolidated by the
Board with or into one or more school districts by May 31 and shall
be effective July 1 of the year the consolidation list is published.

- D. The Board shall promptly consider petitions or move on its own motion to consolidate a school district on the consolidation list developed by the Board pursuant to subsection A of this section in order to enable the affected school districts to reasonably accomplish any resulting consolidation or annexation by July 1 of the year the consolidation list is published.
- E. The Board shall not deny the petition for voluntary consolidation or annexation of any two or more school districts unless:
- 1. The provisions contained in the petition for consolidation or annexation would violate state or federal law; or
- 2. The voluntary consolidation or annexation would not contribute to the betterment of the education of students in the school districts.
- F. 1. In the consolidated or annexed school districts created under this section, the operating and building fund tax levies of the school district shall be determined as set forth in Section 7- 104 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

- 2. In the consolidated or annexed school districts created under this section, the bonded indebtedness of the school district shall be determined as set forth in Section 7-103 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- 3. In the consolidated or annexed school districts created under this section, the division of property, debt, and obligations shall be determined as set forth in Section 7-104 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- G. Nothing in this section shall be construed to require or force the closing of any school site or facility.
- H. No consolidated or annexed school district shall have more than one superintendent.
- I. Noncontiguous school districts may voluntarily consolidate or annex if the school facilities and physical plant of each school district:
- 1. Are within the same county, and the Board approves the consolidation or annexation; or
- 2. Are not within the same county, and the Board approves the consolidation or annexation and finds that:
 - a. the consolidation or annexation will result in the overall improvement in the educational benefit to students in all of the school districts involved, or

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- b. the consolidation or annexation will provide a significant advantage in transportation costs or service to all of the school districts involved.
- J. Contiguous districts may consolidate or annex even if they are not in the same county.

- K. The Board shall promulgate rules as necessary to administer the provisions of this act.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 7-303 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. An elementary school district as defined in Section 1 of this act may submit a request to the State Board of Education to be exempt from the consolidation list published by the Board pursuant to subsection A of Section 2 of this act if the school district meets the following criteria:
- 1. Has received an average grade of a "B-" or above on the annual school reports prepared by the Board pursuant to Section 1210.545 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes. The average grade shall be calculated by averaging the combined points for each school site in the district for the two (2) years immediately preceding the submission of the exemption request; and
- 2. Each school site in the school district is located more than thirty (30) miles from the closest school site of another school district.

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B. The Board shall grant or deny requests for an exemption from
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    the consolidation list based on the application submitted by the
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    school district.
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        SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2016.
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
