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C SCHOOL-PARENT COMPACT: SHARED RESPONSIBILITIES FOR ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT:

1. (Leland School Park) will:

- a.** Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables students to meet Mississippi’s academic achievement standards as follows:

Leland School Park will meet regularly in Professional Learning Communities, core subjects. Through PLCs, we will collaborate on planning, ensuring a guaranteed and viable curriculum for ALL students, administer common formative assessments at least four times a year and each PLC will evaluate data from common formative assessments.

Parents will be provided progress reports on the fourth week of each term . Report cards will be issued at the end of each term. Teachers will also communicate with parents as needed to discuss student achievement with parents.

Parents will be encouraged to share their expertise at Leland School Park. Parents are encouraged to volunteer in school activities and functions such as classroom activities, field trips, and various other functions such as classroom monitor/support and academic opportunity classes. Parents serve as mentors and tutors for students who are having difficulty academically and socially. Mentors/tutors can assist students weekly and biweekly on their homework assignments. - Let my teacher and family know if I need help.
- Come prepared to learn daily
- Be an active participant in class.
- Read on my own at least 20 minutes daily.
- Complete and return all assignments as instructed
- Work on my math and reading skills at home, using materials my teacher sends home.
- Write down my assignments, do my homework daily, and turn it in when due.
- Take ownership in my education and monitor my active students’ account
- Assist parents in use of active parents.
- Conform to the rules of student conduct.
- Encourage parents to communicate with teachers.
