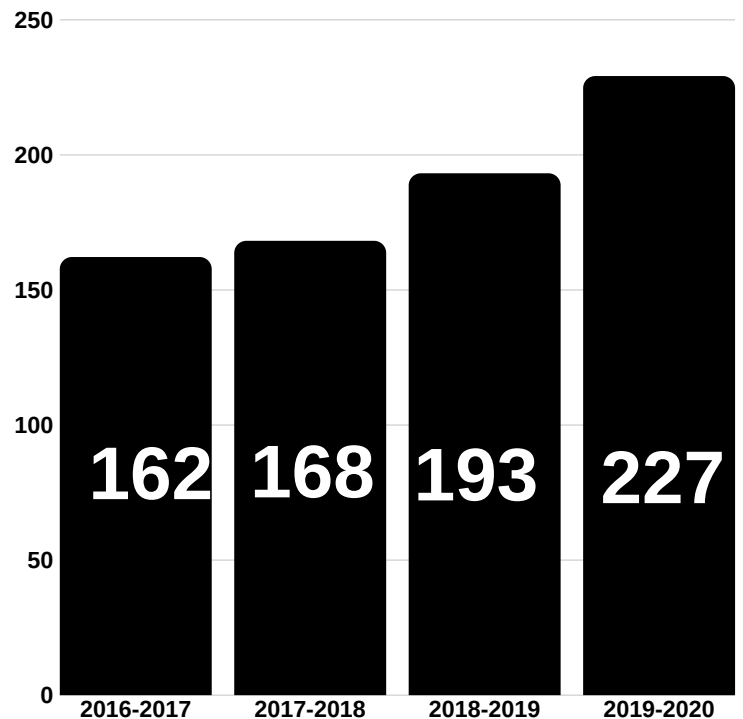


# STS provides free breakfast
