Jemma Carroll, second grade student at Indian Hills Elementary School, took home second place in the annual State Deaf and Hard Hearing Spelling Bee on Tuesday, December 5.

The state competition was broken into grade levels, with contests among first- and second-graders; third- and fourth-graders; fifth- and sixth-graders; seventh- through ninth-graders; and 10th- through 12th-graders.

Jemma’s mother, Tiffany Carroll, says Jemma and her competitor spelled all 100 words correctly during the final round of the contest. The contest decided it would then use words from the third and fourth grade contest, increasing level of difficulty in order to determine the winner. Jemma was declared second place winner. In support of Jemma, Jemma’s teacher Ms. Sheri Hancock attended the competition.

Prior to the state competition, Jemma won first place in the Regional Deaf and Hard of Hearing Spelling Bee in October. Jemma will be recognized at the January 18 School Board Meeting.

INCLEMENT WEATHER INFORMATION



JUST IN TIME FOR COOLER WEATHER!

HERE IS A HELPFUL OVERVIEW OF WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN WEATHER IS SEVERE ENOUGH TO POSSIBLY CANCEL OR DISMISS SCHOOL.

HOW IS THE DECISION MADE TO CANCEL SCHOOL DUE TO INCLEMENT WEATHER SUCH AS SNOW OR ICE?

Before making the decision to delay or cancel school due to weather, we rely on critical input from various sources, to include in-district, as well as outside agencies. We consult with our Transportation Department about road conditions throughout the day and into the night.

WHEN IS THE DECISION MADE TO CANCEL SCHOOL?

In the event that CCPS cancels or delays school (this can include early dismissal), the district's communications department is contacted immediately and information is shared with the public in a timely manner.

HOW WILL THE PUBLIC BE NOTIFIED OF THE DECISION TO CANCEL OR DELAY SCHOOL?

Any updates or changes to the regular school schedule will be communicated through multiple communication channels.
