Currently, the new playground site has been excavated and by the end of May two – three pieces of playground equipment will be relocated along with new equipment stored on site. Unsafe playground equipment will be scrapped. During the summer, the pine trees will be removed, replaced by hardier maples, etc. Asphalt will be removed; detention ponds (rain gardens) will be installed; subsurface will be prepared for asphalt. control unknown persons entering. The electronic visitor management system would	
be a video system with the capacity to scan	
an identifying document and photo. The system builds a data base. The access control	
system allows persons to have access back	
into the building using their access code.	
• Mr. McSherry expressed 'where do we draw	
the line' on security.	
<ul> <li>(2) Perimeter security system: high school and Sarah Noble have perimeter security</li> </ul>	
systems – door sensors at each door. When	
the door is opened an alarm sounds; the	
recommendation is for all schools to have the	
system tying in with security cameras.	
<ul> <li>Mr. Wellman inquired if an individual mans the security panel. Mr. Calhoun replied</li> </ul>	
during the day this is an internal system, but	
after hours it is manned by an outside	
monitoring service.	
• (3) Limited video surveillance accomplished	
by adding more cameras and upgrading digital recording devices.	
<ul> <li>(4) Access controls have been installed on a</li> </ul>	
few doors, the high school has access	
controls on every door; access controls on	
exterior doors at all schools and some interior doors is recommended.	
<ul> <li>(5) Exterior perimeter lighting especially in</li> </ul>	
the rear of some of the buildings; attempts	
will be made to combine high efficient	
lighting on areas that were not sufficiently lit	
in the past. Also being researched is motion sensor lighting.	
<ul> <li>(6) Fencing has been added or repaired at</li> </ul>	
many of the schools. Next budget year	
fencing is proposed for Sarah Noble. Will	
continue to look at fencing as a deterrent for vehicles and/or to keep students from	
running into unsafe areas.	
<ul> <li>(7) Perimeter door ID – this could be done at</li> </ul>	
a low cost. Exterior doors on all buildings	
should have a standardized ID system, i.e.

	<ul> <li>numbering the doors around the buildings; particularly useful in case of emergencies.</li> <li>Mr. Calhoun suggested these items could be talked about and included in the next years' budgets.</li> <li>Mr. McSherry urged prioritizing recommendations; he felt sensors on lights is sensible; perimeter security can be reduced if lighting is adequate.</li> <li>Mr. Calhoun and staff work in conjunction with fire and police with alarm systems. Interior security is required especially when outside groups use buildings after hours.</li> <li>Mr. Wellman inquired if the 2007 study tied in with local experiences. Mr. Calhoun and Mr. Rogozza both commented the report was based on national security issues.</li> <li>Mr. Nichols noted numbering exterior doors for emergency use could be done at a low cost and could be a starting point for other security needs.</li> </ul>
