We have experienced some students being sent to school when not feeling well. To avoid being called to pick up your student after they arrive to school, PLEASE DO NOT send them to school if they are sick. We ask that you follow this daily checklist before sending your child to school. If your child displays ANY of the following symptoms please keep him/her home and report it to our attendance and health office.

In the event your child gets sick at school, please have a plan in place of who can pick him/her up if you are not available.

Students will need to be out of school as quickly as possible for any symptoms. Your diligence will help us keep our students and staff safe and keep our school open. Thank you to all you are complying with these guidelines..

If your child has any of the following symptoms, that indicates a possible illness that may decrease the student's ability to learn and also put them at risk for spreading illness to others. Please check your child for these symptoms:

	Temperature 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or higher when taken by mouth			
	Sore throat			
	New uncontrolled cough that causes difficulty breathing (for students with chronic allergic/asthmatic cough, a change in their cough from baseline)			
	Diarrhea, vomiting, or abdominal pain			
	New onset of severe headache, especially with a fever			
SECTION 2: Close Contact/Potential Exposure				
	Had close contact (within 6 feet of an infected person for at least 15 minutes) with a person with confirmed COVID-19			
	Traveled to or lived in an area where the local, Tribal, territorial, or state health department is reporting large numbers of COVID-19 cases as described in the Community Mitigation Framework			
	Live in areas of high community transmission (as described in the Community Mitigation Framework)

If your student is later than fifteen minutes to school in the morning, please walk in and sign them in, call to excuse them or send them in with a note. At this time, the absence will be counted as a full class period and cannot be counted as a tardy. The first period class will show as an unexcused absence and will have to be explained by a parent or guardian.

The direct line to our Attendance Office is 854-7277. A message can be left on this number 24/7. Any time your student is absent or tardy to school we must receive an excuse. To avoid receiving an automated phone call from our calling system, please excuse an absence before 9:30 a.m. You may also call in advance if you know of a future absence or you can leave a message after hours.



UPDATE PERSONAL INFO AND CUSTODY ISSUES

Please make sure to keep the office updated of all personal information such as telephone numbers, email address, home address, custody changes, and emergency contact information. We make every effort to keep the most current information on file in the event of illness or emergency and for the safety of your child. Please note that by law, if parents are legally separated or divorced, each parent has equal rights to the custody of the child/children UNLESS a parent provides a court order that indicates otherwise. The school MUST HAVE A COPY OF THE COURT ORDER on file, otherwise, either parent may check the child out of school with proper ID.

When making a change of address a NEW proof of Arizona residency must be provided with the current address.


FREE DRESS DAYS

During the year, there will be times when students earn free dress days. On free dress days please keep in mind the following dress code reminders:

- * ALL shirts MUST have sleeves—NO tank tops, spaghetti straps, strapless tops, backless tops, tube tops, beachwear, muscle shirts with deep cut-outs under the arms.

Tips for Building Self-worth in Children

Here are some tips on how to build resilience and self-worth in children. It is important as children get older, that they learn how to handle life's twist and turns, how they can overcome challenges, and believe in themselves through it all.

- Model self-confidence: Children who watch their parents/guardians model resilience and confidence will more likely practice it as well. It doesn't mean you have to pretend to be perfect, but focus on the important things when you are faced with a challenge.
 - a. How do you tackle new tasks?
 - b. Modeling a positive attitude

- c. Be prepared
- d. Don't give up!
- Don't get upset about mistakes: everyone makes mistakes, the important thing is to learn from them. Mistakes happen, what will you do next time?
- · Encourage your child to try new things
- Allow kids to fail, trial and error is how we learn; AND how we get better at making decisions.
- Praise perseverance: learning not to give up. It is not about being successful all the time, but how we overcome adversity and keep trying.
- · Help kids find their passion and identity.
- Set goals: both large and small. Encourage your child to turn dreams into actionable goals;
 make lists and validate interests that will help him/her achieve their goals throughout life.
- Expect them to pitch in-Have your children do age-appropriate jobs around the house.
- Embrace imperfection: remind your children that being less than perfect is human and OKAY.
 Images on social media, TV, and magazines that are depicting "perfection" are not realistic expectations and are destructive.
- Set up your children for success: Children should have opportunities where they can find success- Help your child find activities that make them feel confident and comfortable, this helps them tackle bigger challenges that come their way.
- Show your love: Let your child know that you love them no matter what, even what you are mad at him/her. Make sure your child knows that you think they are great, not just when they do great things, but through all the ups and downs.
