- Today's classroom technology should include interactive boards, projectors, computers, document cameras and student response systems







Technology Progress

Technology was significantly improved!

Classrooms now meet 21st Century standards.

Up-to-date computers were added.

- ✓ 2,595 lab computers
- √ 1,235 laptops for students
- ✓ 2,860 desktop stations for teachers
- √ 1,200 mobile wireless laptops (in mobile carts)
- √ 56 iMac graphic lab computers
- ✓ thin client labs in media centers



Other teaching tools were also added.

- **✓ 1,279 interactive boards**
- √ 1,144 projectors
- √ 1,316 document cameras
- ✓ 29 media center touch panel self check-outs

- ✓ Notebook software for instruction (SMART)





<u>Infrastructure</u> was tremendously improved.




Safety & Security

- ✓ Ran infrastructure in preparation to change 443 analog cameras to IP in the future.

- ✓ Locks with scanners were installed to better control building access.




✓ The fire alarm system was also replaced at 2 schools.



Hallway Projects

Carpet was worn and needed replacing; walls and door frames also needed fresh paint.





Hallways Improved at 14 Schools

- ✓ Removed and replaced ~320,000 square feet of tile and carpet with Vinyl Composition Tile.
- ✓ Hallways and door frames were also repainted.



Facilities HVAC

Many HVAC units were 18 years or older, thus very noisy, inefficient and prone to breakdowns.


