Program Standards

Mission Statement

The mission of Twilight School is to provide an opportunity for long term suspended high school students to earn credits toward graduation while serving their term of suspension.

Program Participants

The population to be served is:

1. Students in grades 9-12 who have been long term suspended.
2. Expelled students as determined by the Executive Director of the Division of Student Support Services.

Goals

The goals of the alternative school are to:

1. Provide instruction to long-term suspended high school students.
2. Maintain rigor in all courses.
3. Ensure that students earn the maximum number of credits allowed in Twilight School.

Twilight School Curriculum

Programmatic Components

To meet the students' needs, the Twilight school staff will:

1. Follow the curriculum as set forth by the Division of Curriculum and Instruction.
2. Determine the end of quarter grades by using the withdrawal grades from the regular day school averaged with grades earned during Twilight School.
3. Attempt to schedule students in courses in which they are currently enrolled during day school.
4. Utilize the Gradpoint program for instruction with teacher direction.
5. Ensure that all academic work is authentic to maintain fidelity of the program.
