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Parents Right to Know Title I School-Wide Programs Parents'

Dear Parents or Guardians:

We are pleased to notify you that in accordance with the Elementary and Secondary Act (ESEA), as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), you have the right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of your child's teacher.

Specifically, you may request the following:

• Whether the teacher has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.

• Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or substitute status.

• The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree.

• Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

If you would like to receive this information or have any questions, please contact your child's school principal.

Sick Day Guidelines (When to keep your student home)

School policy requests a child stay home if he or she:

• Has a fever of 100.4 degrees or higher. Keep your child home until his or her fever has been gone for 24 hours without medication.

 Has been vomiting or has been diarrhea. Keep your child home 12-24 hours after the last vomiting or diarrhea episode.

· Has symptoms that keep him or her from participating in school, such as:

· Very tired or lack of appetite

• Cough that he or she cannot control

 \cdot Moderate to severe headache, body aches or earache

 Sore throat-a minor sore throat is ok for school, but a severe sore throat could be strep throat, even if there is no fever.

Injuries

Students with obvious injuries, such as splints, casts, crutches, etc..., need to present a note from the parent or doctor to the health office that specifies:

• The nature of the injury

What accommodations will be needed

When accommodations will no longer be needed

Your student will not be allowed to participate in activities such as PE and recess until he has been cleared by the doctor or a parent.

Injuries that happen at home, sports actives, or over the weekend need to be address at that time. The Health Office is not a doctor's office.
