A message from our Head Teacher, wishing you a pawsitive holiday season!

Usually at this time of year, whether we are parents, students, or staff,

we are celebrating the successful completion of another Evaline play and looking forward to the next two weeks and all that winter break has to bring. We are tired but excited. We have worked hard, pushed through, met the challenges, and accomplished the goals. We have checked the boxes, completed tasks and cleaned up the little and big messes along the way. We have had our stressful moments, but right about now those seem worth it, and are becoming distant memories as we focus on the holidays ahead. We are thankful, and encouraged. We are happy. That is the norm that we have grown accustomed to. That is how we have learned through experience that it should be at Evaline. That is, until this year.

Each month since March, I have been asked things such as "When will school be back to normal?" or "What about the Feast or the Play or our other traditions and ways of doing things that makes Evaline unique.... What will happen to those?" The fact is, with opening a school during a pandemic, caused by a virus we knew very little about, that was affecting people worldwide, it is as if we are trying to navigate an older and smaller boat in choppy seas on an uncharted voyage. The world became grey, with information, data, rules, expectations, and decisions changing moment by moment and making giving black and white answers no longer realistic nor appropriate. We have faced adversity, and each time, when we pulled together and focused on the children, we persevered, and prospered. The key is to keep the focus on what is truly important and not on all the other "stuff" that we think is representative of how things should be. We need to dig deep, get creative, learn from our past, and make sure our focus is on the priorities Evaline needs to have as a whole.

This week my Father reminded me of this as he reminisced of his time at Evaline, and stories from his Father before him. ... such as the destruction of the old school building and subsequent rebuilding of it by the community... and of the time our community had to financially step in to help secure funds to pay teachers and help cover other necessary expenses when our school funding would not cover those needs. He recalls the time and materials his family donated to the school over the years, as did his neighbors, to keep the school doors open and the students learning... one way or another, even when things were tough. The stories kept going on and on.... With a common theme - giving what you have, not just what you want to give, building people up instead of tearing them down, and putting students first without conditions. As we go into winter break, let's take a page from our history and place more of our focus on our true priorities, the children, and think about how we can contribute and help, and where we can offer support and encouragement. Together, with this focus in mind, I have no doubt we will get through the continued challenges we will face having learned more, and

with a renewed appreciation for many aspects of our everyday life and the people within it.
