School Board Decision to Reopen Evaline

The Evaline School Board convened a Special Board Meeting on Tuesday, September 22nd. In this meeting they voted to begin reopening Evaline School slowly, with a progressive start on Monday, October 5th, 2020. School will begin with Kindergarten and 1st Grade students attending class every other day Monday through Thursday. All safety protocols will be followed. Parents that wish for their students to remain home will continue receiving an updated distance learning format.

Face to face students will begin with an **A/B schedule** on Monday through Thursday. For example, kindergarten will attend school on Monday and Wednesday and 1st Grade will attend school on Tuesday and Thursday. Each classroom will have an A and B group. The purpose of this type of schedule is to help students become acclimated to the new social distancing strategies. These strategies will include, but not be limited to wearing masks, having mask breaks, frequent hand washing, constant 6 foot distancing and structured outside P.E./recess type breaks . You will be notified of your students group and schedule as we release more information next week.

Every effort will be made to have siblings attend school on the same day, however please realize that in some cases this will not be possible.

Progressive Schedule

Each following week, 1 or more grade levels will be added to the calendar until we have all grades returning to school by the end of October.

We have also learned how to begin using a part of a question in our answers to create a top-notch written response. This has been a great week of progress in our fourth grade class as we were finishing up our district testing, and learning more about being positive and productive learners. Mrs. Fletcher and I have been hard at work planning, organizing, and deciding on things to make our distance learning more productive and doable for everyone based in part on the excellent feedback we have recieved from our students and their parents. Thank you for letting us know what is working and what is not.

This upcoming week in Math we will be focusing on finishing up our first chapter and preparing for our test with several days of review of the key concepts. We know there have been some challenging moments as students have been getting used to thinking about and doing math problems, but we are finding a short amount of review and making sure to watch the assigned videos usually meets their needs. Mrs. Fletcher is making sure to add extra tips and tricks on their math pages and is circling the problem she is needing them to complete each day as well as listing them on our daily checklist.

In ELA we will be continuing our work on Narrative writing with a focus on our second story, Scout's Honor. We are beginning to remind students of the need to double check spelling, capitalization, and punctuation in their writing, to enhance the quality of what they are turning in, and increasing our focus on vocabulary.

In Social Studies we are continuing our study of the Constitution, participating in both a read aloud on the topic as well as discussions during our zoom meeting and some fun worksheets that apply the topic to their lives, such as working together to create their own Classroom Bill of Rights. After we finish our study of the Constitution we will be switching our attention to Science for several weeks.

Please note on the weekly schedule that on next Wednesday we will be having a shortened schedule for tasks, and no class ZOOM meeting in order for our staff to meet and work together in the afternoon on preparations related to the upcoming gradual return to school plans our school is working on for October. We are looking forward to when we can all safely return to learning face to face, but until then thank you for all your hard work as students and families in working with us this fall as we participate in distance learning.
