School Responsibilities

Gordo High School will:

3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress. Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows:

The faculty and staff of Gordo High School will keep parents informed of various activities and the progress of their child's academic and social performance on a continual basis. Gordo High School will provide activity events with a minimum of a week's notice so that parents or guardians can adjust their schedule accordingly.

Gordo High School will use a variety of the following methods:

- Progress reports
- Report cards
- Notify Me
- Emails/texts
- Webpage updates
- INow Home Portal

4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff. Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows:

- Before or after school to accommodate the needs of parents or guardians

- During the teacher’s planning period
- Faculty and staff will ensure to bring proper documentation of the student’s progress academically and/or socially for conferences
- Counselors will provide parents with scheduling sessions/calendars upon request

5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child’s class and to observe classroom activities as follows:

- Gordo High School will maintain an open door policy
- Invite parents and guardians to chaperone and/or assist with various school sponsored events
