In the Kindergarten classroom

The kindergarten team will work with parents and family members to support student success in reading and writing.

Teachers will:

In Reading:

- O Provide parents with the retelling tools and a bag of blackline books.
- Provide parents with a list of sight words to practice daily with the student.

In Writing.

O Provide parents with ABC chart and letter formation guide.

At Home

Parents and family members can support student success in reading and writing at home.

Parents will:

In Reading:

- O Read a book and ask the student to retell.
- Practice sight word list daily with student (given in units)

In Writing.

O Help the student practice correctly writing the alphabet daily.

Kindergarten Students

To make connections between learning at home and school, students will:

In Reading:

- O Take bag of blackline books to keep at home, read with a parent daily and answer the retell questions about what you read.
- O Take list of sight words home and practice daily with a parent.

In Writing.

- O Take letter formation sheet home to practice with parents.
- O Practice writing beginning, middle, & ending sounds of simple words using letter formation sheet with parents.
