"I am helping to store up food for the winter," said the Ant, "and I recommend that you do the same."

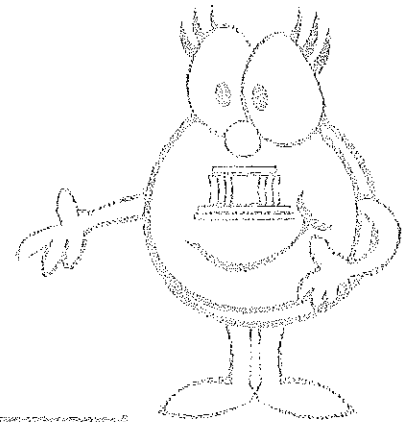
"Why bother about winter?" asked the Grasshopper; "we have plenty of food right now."

Build-A-Bike Spinner

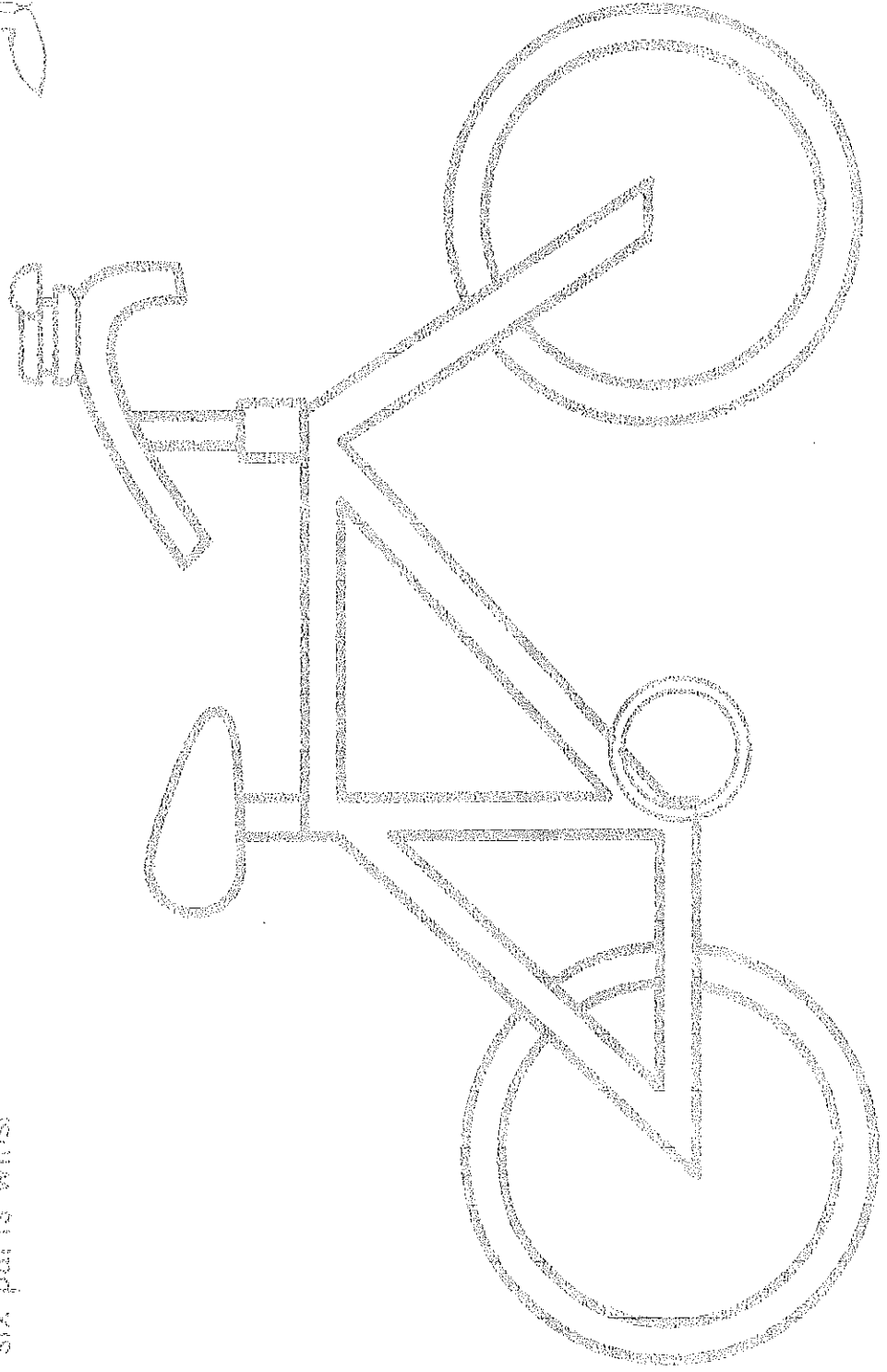
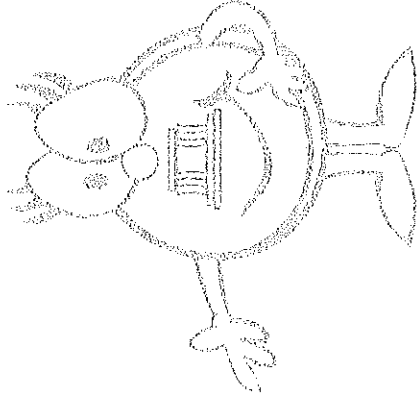

5. Spread a thin layer of glue on the sheep's body and tail.

6. Fill in the sheep's body and tail with cotton balls or paper circles.

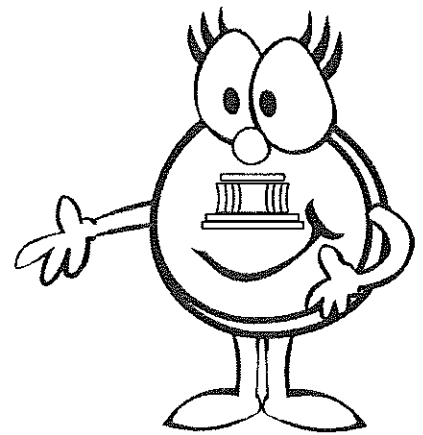
7. Write all group members' names on the back of the paper.
