The PSAT will take approximately 2 hours, 55 minutes to complete. The SAT School Day will take approximately 4 hours, 25 minutes.

What to Bring

- Two No. 2 pencils with erasers
- An approved calculator—we will provide an approved calculator for every student.

What Not to Bring

- Any devices, including smartwatches, that can be used to record, transmit, receive or play back audio, photographic, text, or video content
- Protractors, compasses, rulers
- Highlighters, colored pens, colored pencils, mechanical pencils
- Pamphlets or papers of any kind
- Food and drinks—including bottled water

Turn Off All Electronic Devices

You'll need to turn off all electronic devices during the test and even during breaks. This includes cell phones. Be sure to turn off your watch alarm, if you have one.
