Overview

During the first week of school classroom teachers will be responsible for instructing students on the school rules and equipment. Parapros and specialists will reinforce these expectations. Monthly data will determine focus areas to address. Revist/re-teach all school rules the first weeks of October, November, January, and April. Classroom teachers will also introduce the purpose and procedures of "BARK", "Refocus!" and "Discipline Referral" slips. Each teacher will provide a checklist of areas to cover as well as lesson ideas and student ideas.

Positive Behavior Recognition

"BARK" Slips

- 1. "BARK" slips are given to students who are "caught" by teachers and staff doing something Safe, Respectful, Responsible or Kind.
- 2. Students place the completed form in the "BARK" container in their classroom. These will go into a school wide container in the office.
- 3. Daily drawings for "BARK" winners may be done in your classroom, but BARK winners will be drawn to choose a prize from the office during morning announcements at least 8 days per month.

BARK Tickets are all white!

Unwanted Behavior Reminder Student Tracker Slips

- 1. Students will receive a "tracker" for doing something that is not Safe, Respectful, Responsible or Kind.
- 2. Whoever writes a "tracker" slip will address the issue with the student using the steps on the behavior flow chart, then give the slip to the classroom teacher the same day.
- 3. Classroom teacher will log the "tracker" slip information on Synergy Student Comments and contact parents if needed. Classroom teacher then places tracker slip in the office to be recorded.
- 4. If a student received three "trackers" within two weeks of school, they will receive an DR, according to the flow chart, with parent contact made by the principal.
- 5. Whoever writes a "tracker" slip that needs office attention will send student to office immediately and then fill out the DR. Administrator, reporter, and classroom teacher will conference to determine follow-up.

Specialist and Duty Staff

- 1. Students will receive a "tracker" for doing something that is not Safe, Respectful, Responsible, or Kind.
- 2. For Minor behavior issues:
 - Redirect, re-teach, model and/or remind student of expectations THEN stand on red feet/timeout if needed.
 - Turn "tracker" into the classroom teacher the SAME DAY.
 Please use your professional judgement on length and amount of re-teaching, rehearsing, and time outs given before writing a "tracker".
- 3. Teachers will use "trackers" as teaching tools until the first part of October.

Playground Students Behavior Management Process

- 1. Observe problem behaviors.
- 2. Determine if it is minor or major (refer to flowchart).
- 3. Major offenses student goes straight to office with a tracker slip explaining the offense. Referring staff will write ODR ASAP.
- 4. Minor offenses follow these steps.
 - Re-direct, re-teach, model and/or remind students of expectations THEN stand on red feet/timeout if needed.
 - Put the tracker slip in the classroom teacher's box in the office.
 - Please use your professional judgement on the length and amount of re-teaching, rehearsing, and time outs given before writing the tracker.
 - 5 to 1 ratio is optimal always (5 positive to negative)
 - The expectation is to stop the unwanted behavior.

Classroom Students Behavior Management Process

- 1. Observe problem behaviors.
- 2. Determine if it is minor or major (refer to flowchart).
 - Major offenses need immediate administration support, with DR.
 - Minor offenses follow these steps:
 - Re-direct, re-teach, model and/or remind students of expectations THEN stand on red feet/timeout if needed.
 - > Teacher contacts the parent (written or verbal) if needed and records it in Synergy.
 - > 3 "refocus" in two weeks = major following steps in flowchart
 - > 5 to 1 ratio is optimal always (5 positive to negative)
 *if behavior continues contact office for support

Inappropriate Verbal Language or Abusive Language/ Profanity	Name Calling; profanity not directed at anyone.	Abusive language toward another individual (student or teacher; profanity directed toward another with intent to harm.)
Physical Contact or Fighting/ Physical Aggression	Shoving; rough play that continues after warnings.	Physical contact made with intent to harm another, starting/initiating a fight.
Defiance/ Disrespect or Non-Compliance	Refusal to obey; rude comments or gestures towards staff or other adults in the building.	Repeated/ continuous refusal to follow directions; any defiance combined with inappropriate language.
Disruptive Behavior	Disruption to others/class after reminder; continued distractions to others/class after reminder; purposeful disruption.	Continual; whole class disruptions; ongoing intentional disruption to class.
Property Misuse or Damage/ Vandalism	First time offense; damage to smaller items.	Serious/ costly damage, intentional damage/ misuse.
Dress Code Violation	Classroom disruption; reference to alcohol/ drugs; attire that may be unsafe; threats to other students.	Repeated disruption, unsafe, threatening or drug/alcohol related.
Forgery / Theft	First offense (small item)	Forgery; repeated minor thefts; theft of others' items, money, or school supplies / equipment.
Harassment/ Bullying	First offense; infrequent teasing, non- harassing / bullying.	Repeated/ ongoing teasing; sexual/racial/demographic harassment.
Lying / Cheating	First offense; copying / using another's work.	Chronic, repeated incidents, lying with intent to harm others.
Attendance Issues	3 + unexpected tardies and/or 3 unexpected absences within a calendar month. Notify parents.	Exceeds the 3+ unexpected tardies and/or 3 unexcused absences within a calendar month.
Weapons	Toys, pictures, student made.	Actual weapons; toys used to scare or intimidate others.
