

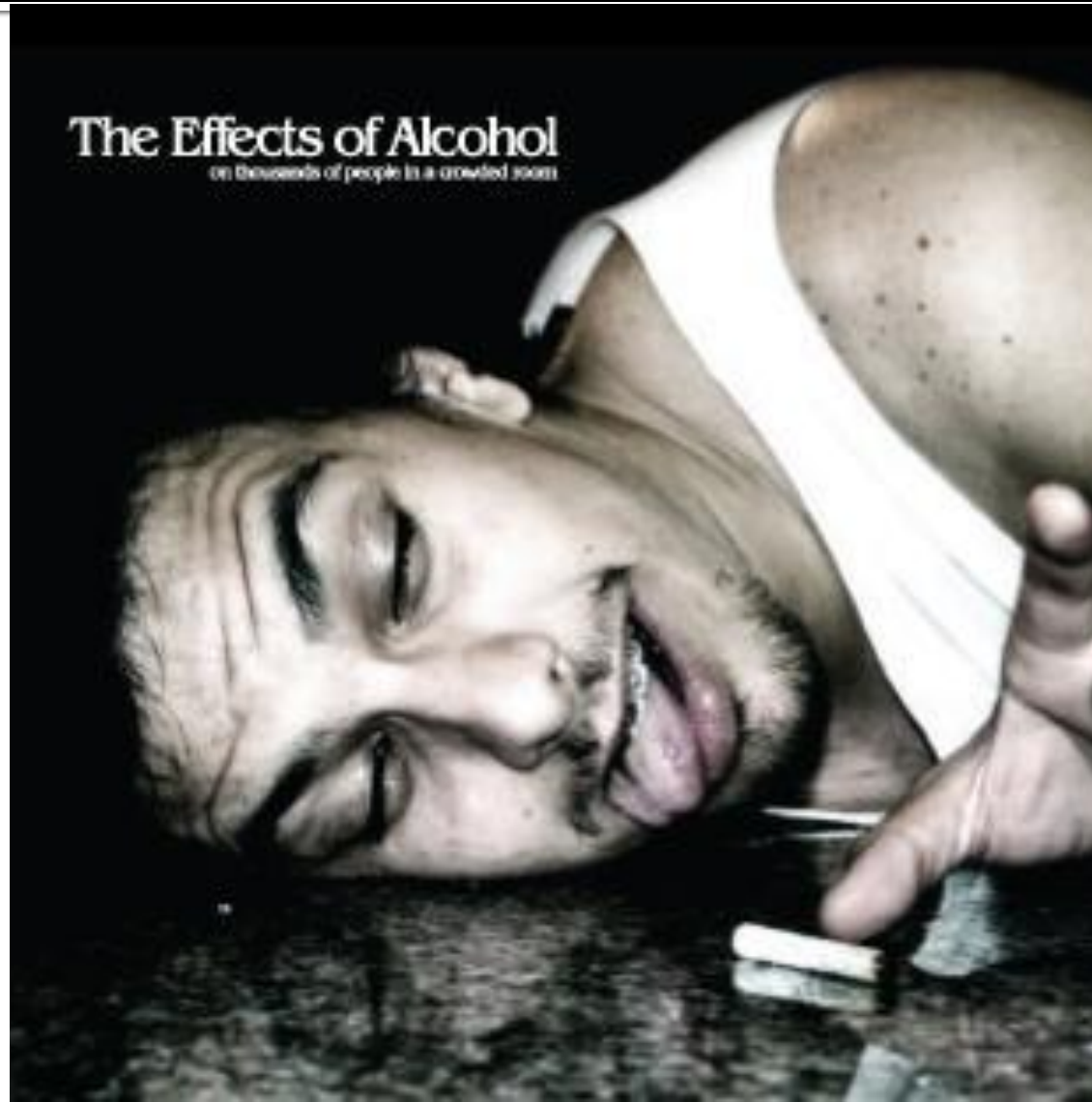

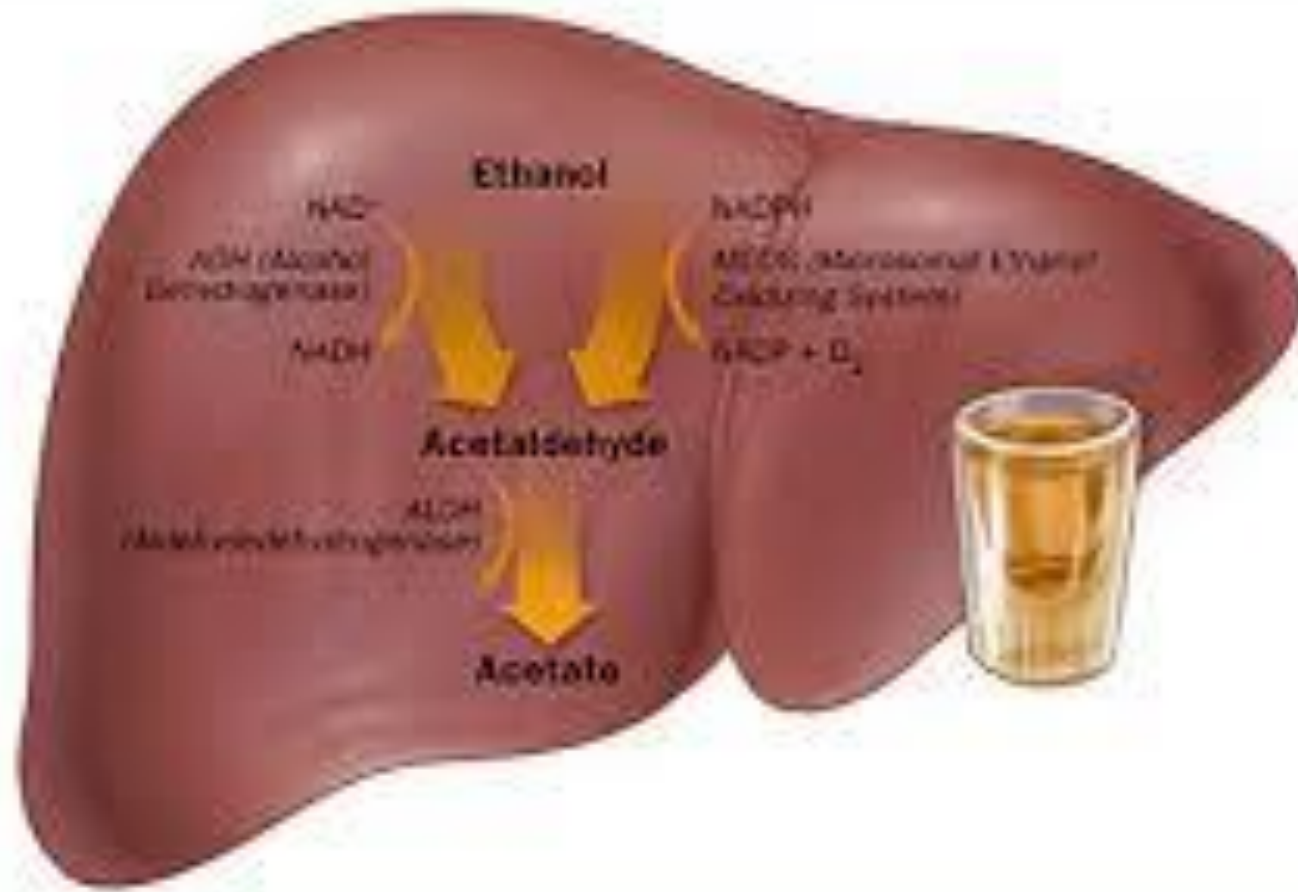


Figure 7. Products of ethanol metabolism in the liver.

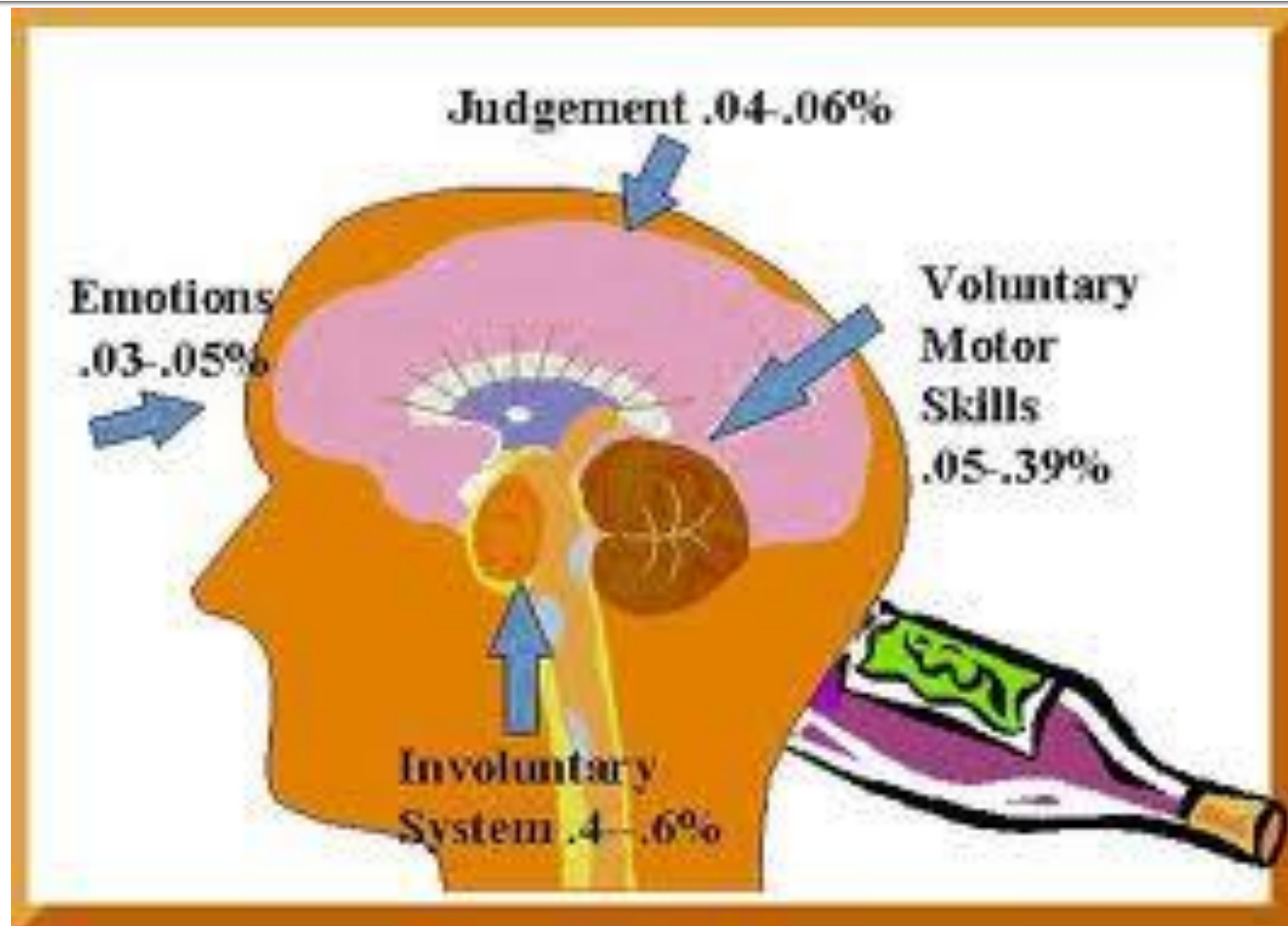

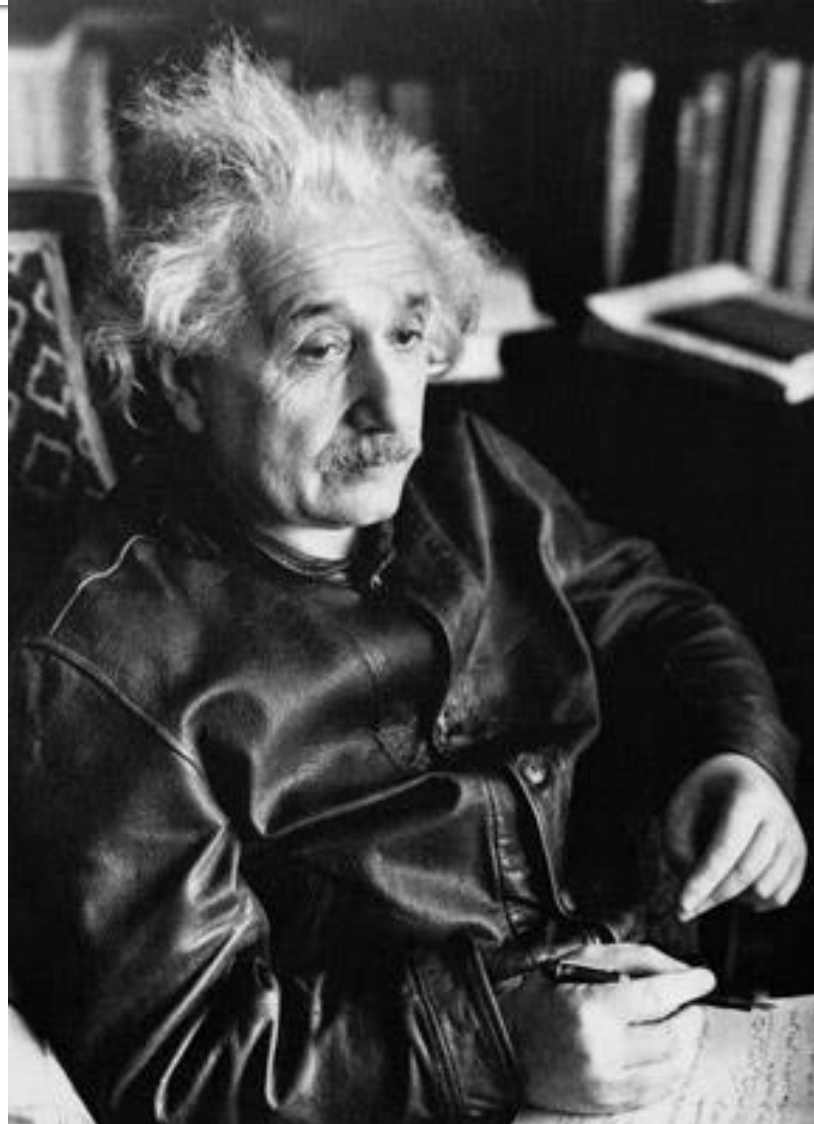

Proof & Percentage of Alcohol

PROOF is a term given to the measurement of alcohol in a distillate.

The relationship of PROOF to PERCENTAGE OF ALCOHOL is two to one. Put another way, percentage is one-half of proof.

A 100 proof whiskey, would contain 50 percent alcohol. A spirit with 40 percent alcohol would be 80 proof.
