The entertainment industry is hit hard by the pandemic. Studios are forced to shut down or delay production of TV shows and films in many countries. Movies already slated for release are stymied by closed theaters and ordinances against crowds. Theater chain AMC loses \$900 million in the third quarter of 2020, even as theaters begin reopening. Record scratch Whaaaat? For the first time in 34 years, vinyl records outsell compact discs. According to The Recording Industry Association of America, vinyl makes up \$231.1 million of all music sales in just the first six months of 2020 (compared to the measly \$129.9 million brought in by CDs).



From COVID Lockdown to Federal Lockup >

14 men are arrested by the FBI for orchestrating a domestic terrorist plot to kidnap Michigan Gov. Gretchen Whitmer. A federal grand jury indicts six men with felony charges, while eight others are charged with state crimes. Federal investigators identify it as a plot by anti-government extremists who are dissatisfied with the governor's strict orders to stay-at-home and control the spread of coronavirus.



Power to the Players

After learning that hedge fund investors are betting on the failure of GameStop stock (in a move called Short Selling), Reddit users—the type who call stocks "stonks" and have a soft spot for video games—rally behind the brick-and-mortar retailer, buying up shares of GameStop to drive up the price. Stock values increase more than 800% and cost Wall Street short sellers billions.



"It's a Boy-Oh-Boy!"

Fireworks at a gender reveal party spark one of a record-setting number of California wildfires in 2020. Over 4.1 million acres are burned and over 10,000 structures are destroyed. The August Complex fire becomes California's first "giga-fire," a blaze that burns over 1 million acres of land.

SCOTUS is Ruthless

Judge Amy Coney Barrett takes the Constitutional Oath and is sworn in as a Supreme Court Justice, filling the position left vacant by the passing of Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg.

Neither Healthy Nor Wealthy

COVID-19 is not only a public health crisis, it also negatively affects the global economy and financial markets. Supply chains are disrupted worldwide. Unemployment reaches record high numbers. When people stay home retail and service industries suffer, the travel industry can't get off the ground, and the hospitality industry closes its doors. Meanwhile, online shopping sites and streaming services see record gains as people are doing more from home than ever before.

IBM's Mayflower Autonomous Ship is one of the first full-sized vessels capable of self-navigating across oceans and spending long periods of time alone at sea. The ship will gather vital environmental data that will help scientists understand critical issues such as global warming, micro-plastic pollution and marine mammal conservation.



The Beginning of the Biden-Harris Administration >

On Jan. 20, 2021, Joseph R. Biden is sworn in and becomes the 46th President of the United States. In his inaugural address, the president recalls the challenges facing the country and calls for unity. Kamala Harris is the first woman, African American and person of South Asian descent to be sworn in as vice president of the United States.





The First Step Towards Our Old Normal

The US FDA approves two COVID-19 vaccines for emergency use, one from drug company Pfizer, the second from Moderna. Frontline health workers and residents and staff of long-term care facilities will be the first to receive the COVID-19 vaccine. The goal is for everyone to be able to easily get a COVID-19 vaccine as soon as possible.

Send Your X Into Orbit

Elon Musk launches a new era of space travel when the SpaceX Falcon 9 sends two astronauts into orbit, nearly 10 years after the US government ends their space shuttle program. Falcon 9 is a reusable, two-stage rocket designed for the reliable and safe transportation of people and equipment into Earth's orbit and beyond.

The Year That Should Have Zoomed By

Every school has its own way of operating in a pandemic, and for many of us school looks very different compared to last year. Most schools start using some form of virtual or distance learning, either full-time or on a "hybrid" schedule. Many clubs, activities and sports are restricted. There are clear plastic dividers everywhere. We have temperature checks in the building and microphone checks on Zoom. And for most of us, masks are mandatory and handshakes are history.



A Summer for Social Justice

When footage of the death of George Floyd in Minneapolis, MN goes viral, social justice movements, marches, and protests take center stage. In more than 2,000 cities and towns in 60 countries, masses fill the streets demanding racial equality, speaking out against policies that facilitate systemic racism.

A Massive Buzzkill

Sightings of Asian giant hornets (*Vespa mandarinia*) in Washington prompt fears that the vicious, invasive insect could devastate the US honey bee population. A hornet's sting is painful, but the effects of a reduced honey bee population hurts more; honey bees are responsible for pollinating the fruit, plants and nuts that humans eat, and the alfalfa that feeds the animals that provide meat and dairy to people. Without honey bees, we all get stung.



Protest Takes Violent Turn

Angry protesters storm the US Capitol building on Jan. 6, 2021 in an attempt to stop a joint session of Congress from confirming Joe Biden's victory. The Senate and House of Representatives are evacuated as rioters occupy and ransack the empty chamber, posting videos to social media all the while, making it easy for the FBI to arrest over 200 people within two weeks of the riot. Five people die from the event, and dozens are injured.

Powerful Explosions Shatter Beirut

In Lebanon's capital city of Beirut, a fire reaches a 2,750-ton stockpile of ammonium nitrate causing two devastating explosions. The catastrophic blasts destroy 85% of the country's grain supply and cause \$15 billion in property damage and leave at least 200 dead, 7,500 injured, and an estimated 300,000 people homeless. Lebanese government declares a state of emergency to deal with the aftermath. The explosions ripple through the industrial waterfront, extending to popular nightlife and shopping districts and densely populated neighborhoods.

Hitty Hitty Bang Bang <

The trio of brothers Adam, Jack and Ryan, known as AJR, break through to the Billboard Hot 100 top 10 for the very first time thanks to their unstoppable single "Bang!" hitting No. 9 nearly a year after its release. It's the track we can't stop listening to. While we're all adding this one to our playlist, the brothers are hard at work on a new album they say will be their "most extreme."

That's a Catchy Song, Who Sings It? >

"Dance Monkey" by Tones and I becomes the "most Shazamed" song of all time. ^ **Dynamite Explodes**

BTS release "Dynamite," a disco-pop hit that's exactly what their fans need in a hard year. The song, which dominated the charts, is BTS's first entirely English single. The guys' outfits from the music video are expected to raise more than \$20,000 in an auction for COVID-19 relief.

And then he quickly changes it again when his second hit single "Before You Go" tops the charts in the UK. → **Happiness Continues for Five More Minutes**

The Jonas Brothers perform at the 2020 Grammy Awards. In addition to singing their recently-released hit "What a Man Gotta Do" they also treat fans to a glimpse of the then-unreleased track "Five More Minutes." Much to fans' delight, Shazaming the band's performance unlocks a video announcing their upcoming album.

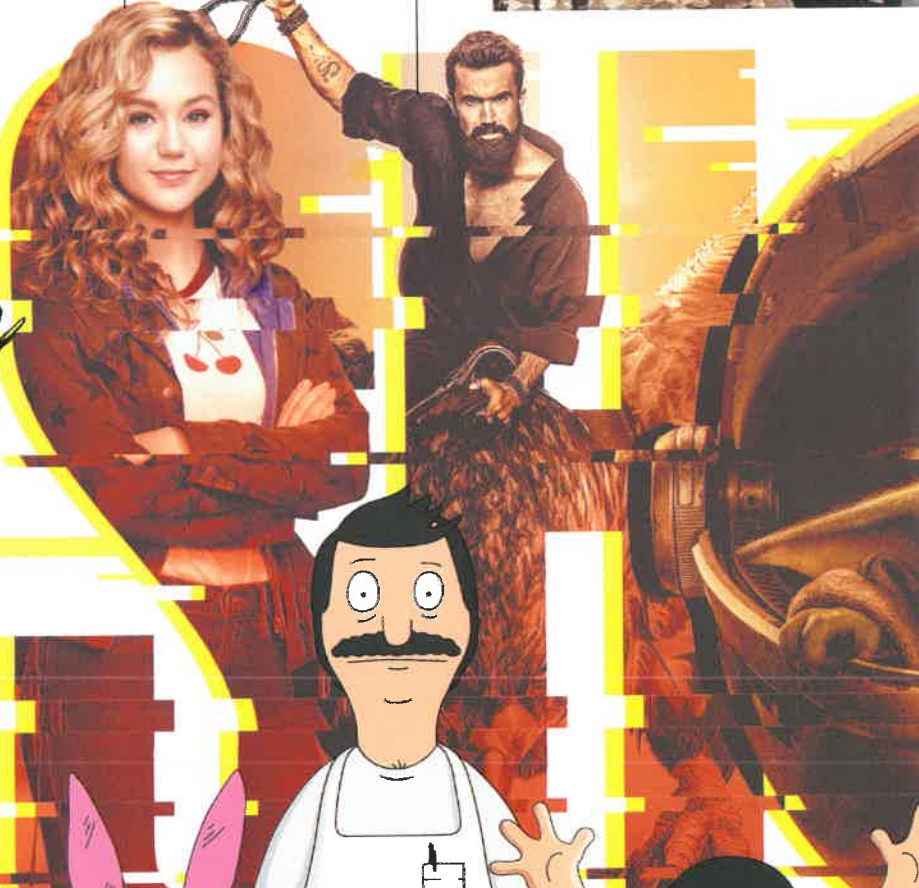
It's Always Sunny In Silicon Valley

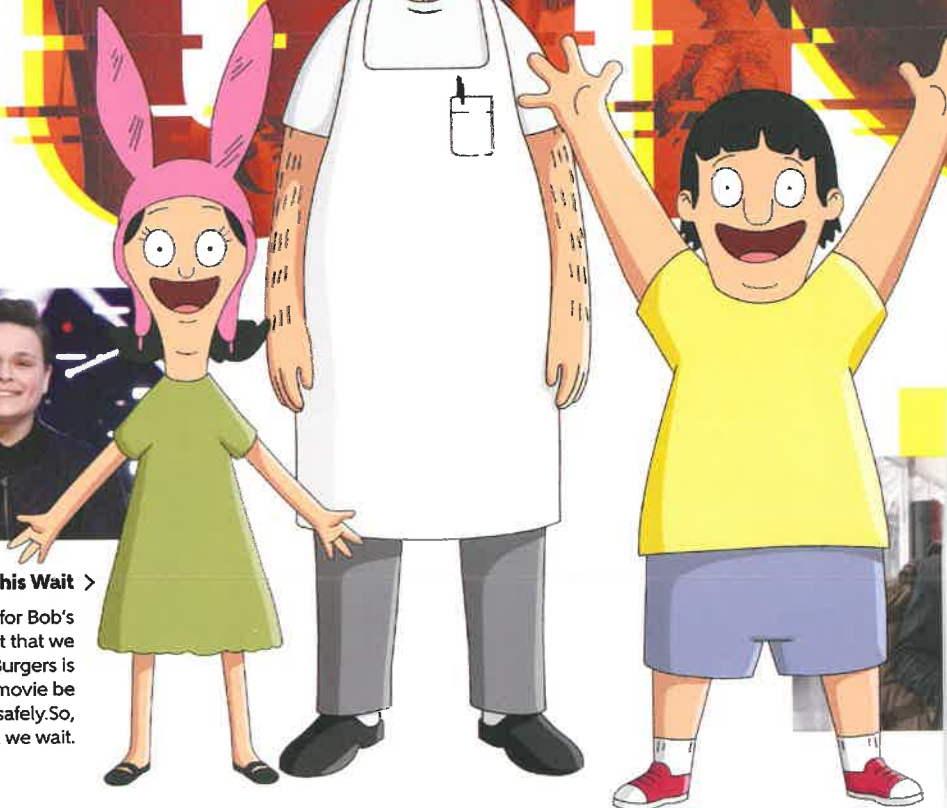

< **We Watch it Every Knight**

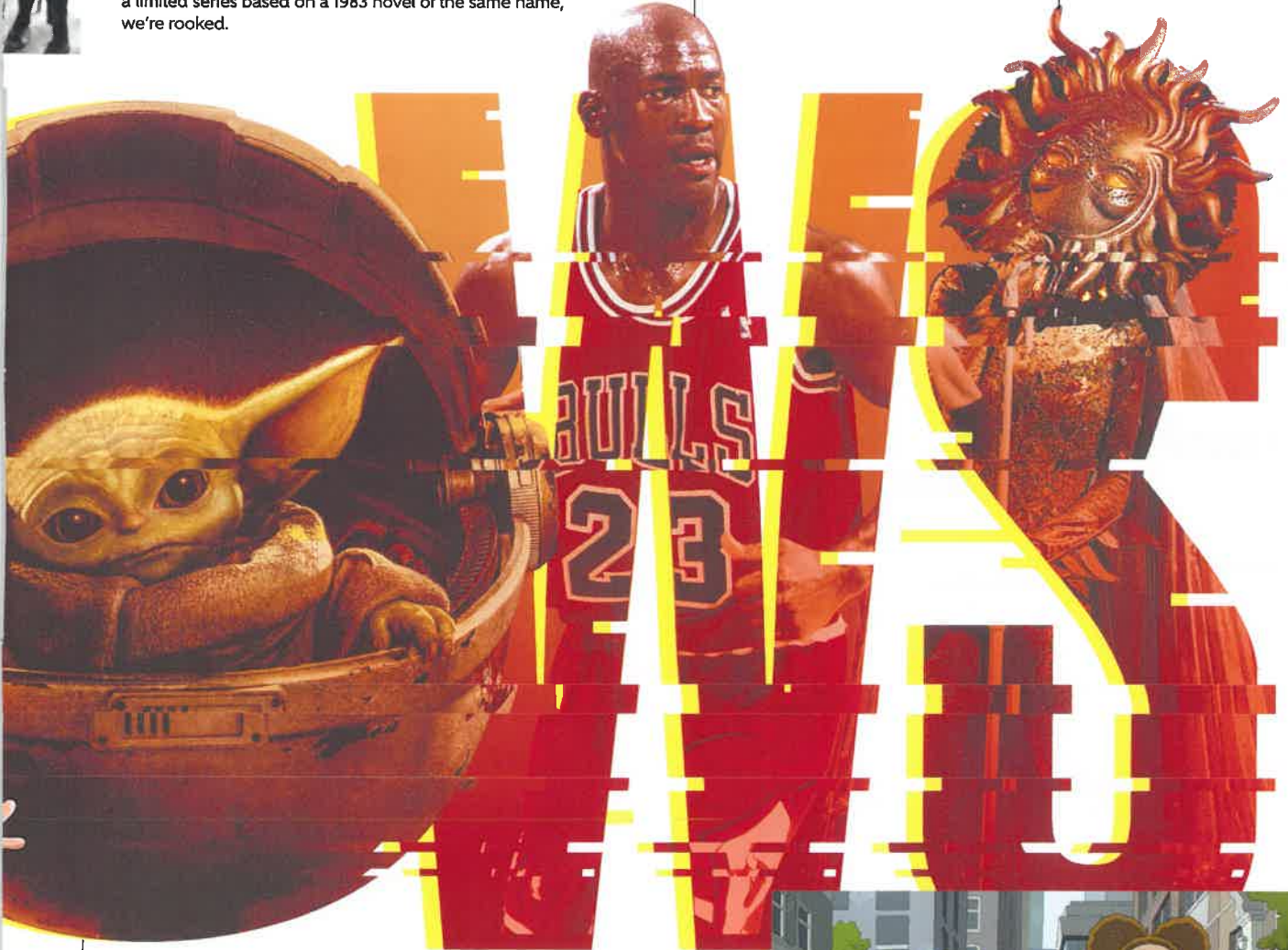

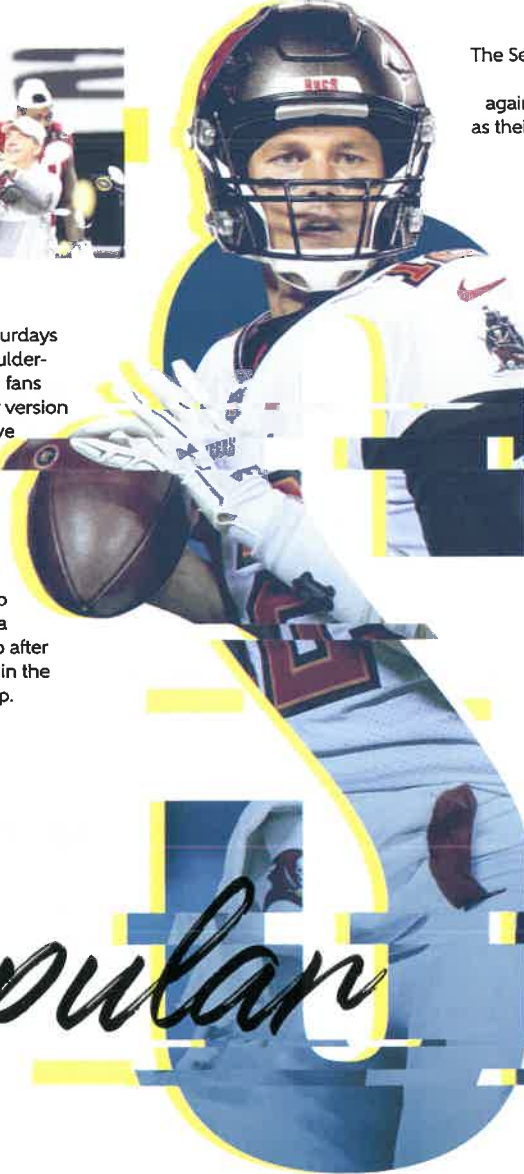
Brady's Bunch Beats KC's Young QB

Due to the initial surge of COVID-19 cases, the 2020 Tokyo Summer Olympics are tentatively rescheduled for July 2021. The Los Angeles Dodgers beat the Tampa Bay Rays 3-1 in Game 6 of the World Series. They claim their first championship since 1988, putting an end to the shortest, strangest season in Major League Baseball history.

→ **You Goal, Girl!**

Vanderbilt kicker Sarah Fuller makes history again as the first woman to score points in a Power Five game when she kicks an extra point in the first half of the Commodores' game against Tennessee. She previously made history as the first woman to play in a Power Five game, kicking the ball off against Missouri.



^ **Tampa Bay Lights Up Dallas Stars**

The Tampa Bay Lightning win their second Stanley Cup Championship, and first since 2004, with a 2-0 victory against the Dallas Stars in Game 6 of the Stanley Cup Finals. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the entire series was played in September behind closed doors at Rogers Place in Edmonton, Alberta.

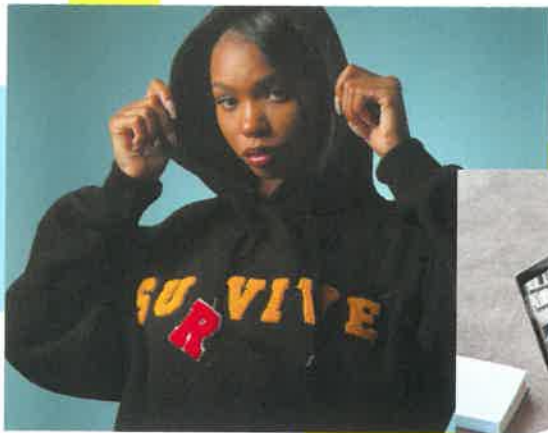
