History and Background

Greetings to all supporters, donors and friends of the LOGGER Stadium project. The committee wanted to keep you informed of our progress. We thought the development and publishing of a newsletter is a good way to accomplish this task. I do want to thank ALL of you. Through your efforts we have raised almost \$57,000 going into the 2021 year and phase two of the project.

In the spring of 2020 I asked superintendent Miller if I could start a fundraising project to

secure funds for a stadium to go with the new track and football field at Vernonia Schools. After receiving the ok from Mr. Miller the first person I contacted was Jim

Eckland, Jim is the former Chairman of the Sports Initiative arm of the Vernonia Education Foundation. Jim was instrumental in the fundraising to develop Alumni Field, home of Lady Logger softball and Holce Field the home of Logger Baseball. Jim agreed to help cochair this project. We began with a meeting and several emails to put together a list of people who would be interested in serving on the committee to complete this project. With that, the LOGGER Stadium committee and project were under way and the work began.

With the help of Tony Hyde, we met with fundraising consultant John Donovan who is advising us at no charge. John was involved with fundraising when the new school was built several years ago and has a heart for Vernonia. This help will be invaluable as we work toward accomplishing our goals. A big thank you to Tony for setting this up. help operate and support the schools. Your donations range from \$25 to \$5,000 and added up to over v\$33,000. Most of you wrote checks and a few donated online through our GoFundMe page. Most of you are retirement age and donated a few years ago to help build the softball field for VHS, but we have also gained some younger donors, and some new donors. The Vernonia Education Foundation has pledged \$25,000 to help support our campaign. We are grateful to all of you!



A Case for Support

Like many small towns, Vernonia's heart is with its kids, gathering on evenings and weekends to cheer on the young athletes and supporting the school's teams. Vernonia Schools has served our families up on the hill since 2012 and the community, alumni and local champions have stepped up to support the completion of the playgrounds, track and ball fields that are key to a complete school campus.

Now the final phase of this vision has come into focus, a covered stadium structure that will host families, fans and guests from across Northwest Oregon. The Logger Stadium structure will provide cover for fans, concession facilities and restrooms. Once completed, up to 900 fans and family members will be able to gather under cover and cheer on the Loggers in football and track and field competitions. A local group of alumni and community volunteers have already raised almost \$60,000 toward the Phase 1 goal of \$850,000. A second phase (\$300,000) will construct team rooms under the grandstands as well as additional restrooms. We need everyone's help to finish this last key piece of the school campus. Vernonia's Logger Stadium will complete the school's facilities and bring the community closer together as only a school's sporting contests and traditions can. The addition of a 900 seat stadium will bring district championships and regional competitions into Vernonia to boost the local economy and increase Vernonia's exposure to visitors.

Please consider what contribution you can make to help our community cross this goal line together! Donations are welcome in the form of financial contributions, in-kind materials or volunteer time.

Needs and Fundraising

Looking at the needs, it was determined to include a separate concession and restroom facility with team rooms under the stadium. To achieve our goals, the steering committee decided to divide the project into three phases. The first phase was funding the stadium itself. We started this off with a letter writing campaign that many of you donated to and can continue to donate to. We also started a Go Fund Me account for those that wish to donate online. Our second portion of fund raising is to seek the support of larger donors and corporate sponsors.

If you know of any possible corporate sponsors or persons interested in donating, large tax-deductible amounts please send us their contact information. We are seeking the assistance

of the Vernonia Education Foundation as a 501c3 entity to handle the funds we receive.
