#### **EMPOWERING STAFF, ENGAGING COMMUNITIES AND EDUCATING STUDENTS**

The Sunflower County Consolidated School District began planning for the 2020-2021 school year as early as April, when it became clear that the 2020 school year would end prematurely. As COVID-19 numbers began to rise, particularly in Sunflower County, a traditional return to school seemed more unlikely. The first plan for the district was to offer a "Hybrid" schedule, whereby all campuses would be divided into two groups that would allow for reduced enrollment and social distancing. Under this model, students would attend school on either Monday and Wednesday or Tuesday and Thursday. In July, as COVID-19 numbers continued to

increase, the district modified its plan to include a 100% virtual option for parents, allowing them the choice to have their children stay at home and gain instruction virtually. When August arrived and statewide numbers steadily increased, coupled with Sunflower County being deemed a "hotspot," the district made the following decisions: Delay the start of school for staff (August 24th) and students (September 8th) and require 100% Virtual Learning for ALL students

# Question: What is virtual learning?

Virtual learning uses computer software, the internet, or a combination of both to deally and stored for students to access at various times.

**Question: How long** will we be virtual? We will begin virtually for the first 9 weeks. The district will make a decision within the first 9 week period if it will continue for the 2nd 9-weeks or choose another learning option for students. It is possible that virtual learning could last for all 4 9-week grading periods OR it could last for a partial number of the periods. The

## STUDENT EXPECTATIONS FOR VIRTUAL LEARNING

Attend all virtual classes assigned. Log in at least 5 minutes before classes are scheduled to begin Appropriate classroom behavior is expected in virtual classrooms. Respect the teacher and your peers. Find a distraction-free, quiet environment to log into your class or meeting. Have school supplies nearby (Ex. paper, pencil, any materials issued by the school, or etc.)

Be energized, attentive, and ready to learn. Use a virtual background to keep your surroundings private. This will allow yourteacher to see you and not your space. Use the chat box to ask your teacher questions. Please keep your device on mute until you want to speak. This will help to limit background noise. If you would like to speak or answer a question, use the "Raise Hand" feature. Then unmute yourself

after you are called on by your teacher.

Use earphones or a headset with an external mic for best hearing and speaking capabilities. Please take care of your personal needs (basic hygiene, eating, talking to others in your home, etc.) prior to entering a Zoom classroom. Remember to sign out or "leave the meeting" when the session is finished.

## SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY FOR VIRTUAL LEARNING

The SCCSD will not require students who are engaged in virtual learning to wear school uniforms. Virtual learning typically involves a camera that shows an individual's upper body and face. Though uniforms will not be worn, students should be mindful of presentation via camera and adhere to the following rules from our traditional dress code policy: Hats, hair rollers, head wraps, bandanas, and "Do-Rags" are not to be worn. Use of dark glasses is limited to students with

medical prescriptions.

Any accessory or clothing item that advertises drugs, alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, obscene language/gestures and/or bullying shall not be permitted. Midriffs shall not be exposed. Tank tops, muscle shirts or halter-tops shall not be allowed.

No see-through clothing may be worn. Excessively tight or revealing clothing is prohibited. Mouth pieces/jewelry/teeth coverings will not be allowed.

Limit Distractions. A "digital quarantine" might be necessary to keep your child's attention focused on their schoolwork.


Make Space for Learning. It's important to set up a quiet, clutter-free area if your child is learning full-time from home.

Maintain Breaks. Routines and schedules are extremely important for children at school, and this is no different at-home.

Balance Screen Time. Overuse of screen time can have adverse impacts on young brains, so it's important to mix it up during a time like this.

Use accessibility features. Most devices have built-in assistive technology . For example, read aloud or text-to-speech can help struggling readers.

Reach out to your child's teacher. Set up a



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direct line of communication by email, text, phone calls, or even video conferencing. Also, check in with other parents to see what they've found effective, and ask if they need help as well.

Use a Schedule. Having a clear vision of what is expected of your child will help them see that just because they are home does not mean they don't have work to do.

## **SCCSD Connectivity Overview**

#### **Technology Usage Fee**

Each student in the SCCSD will receive a computer and a hotspot. For each device, there will be a \$25 annual technology usage fee. This technology usage fee covers the insurance pro-tection for each technological device each student receives.

Examples of the Technology Usage Fee

If a student chooses to accept a SCCSD computer and hotspot, there would be a \$50 dollar technology usage fee.

If a student chooses to accept a SCCSD computer but not a hotspot, there would be a \$25 dollar technology usage fee.

If a family with two students accepts a SCCSD computer and hotspot, there would be a \$100 dollar technology usage fee.

# Below is the explanation for each grading category:

1. Tests are bi-weekly assessments and administered based on the testing schedule. NO other tests should be administered. (Not the Benchmark or 9-Weeks' tests!)

2. Quizzes are assessments that have less than 20 questions.

3. Projects are cumulative performance-based assessments in which students compose or demonstrate learning over a period of time. There is an end-product and may also include a presentation of this product to the class.

4. Presentations are speeches, recitations, oral deliveries, verbally guided PowerPoints, etc. in which students speak about learning in front of an audience/virtually (teacher, student, parents, etc.)

5. Pop Quizzes are unannounced quizzes that occur after sufficient teaching and learning have occurred.

6. Exit Tickets, independent practice, and other activities that occur within the class or virtually after sufficient teaching and learning have occurred are considered Classwork.






# Medical Advice mask-wearing, sanitation at home

Schools are direct extensions of our community. The spread of contagious illnesses in our neighborhoods results in higher risks for disease spreading in our schools.

Therefore, the following actions will mitigate the spread of COVID-19 and help our students stay well while learning from home.

• Wearing a face mask protects other people in case you are infected.

• Use household disinfectants to clean & disinfect frequently touched surfaces daily. This includes tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keyboards, toilets, faucets, and sinks.


