Dear Parents:

The 1994 session of the General Assembly amended the <u>Code of Virginia</u> to require each division superintendent to prepare and post the proposed average per pupil cost for public education in the division for the coming school year, as well as estimates for the current school year and actual per pupil data for the previous school year.

- (d) Table 15 of the 2019-20 Superintendent's Annual Report for the Virginia Department of Education reflects state average per-pupil expenditures of \$13,241.
