# Kelliher School Superintendent's Message

After being tasked by the Governor with planning for three scenarios of learning: in-person, hybrid, and distance learning- staff from our school got busy thinking about how we could offer high quality, flexible, and responsive education to students and parents, regardless of what model we were in as a district. Discussions about schedules, attendance, teaching, and learning approaches, technology, and meeting students' need have been challenging, but our goal of equitable learning for all kept us motivated.

Now we look ahead to the start of school, committed to using science, data, and the guidance created by the Department of Education and the Department of Health. Our local data indicated that we will be able to start the school year in-person or in the hybrid model for all learners, but we know that the community spread of COVID-19 may require us to move to more restrictive models and we will be ready. We believe that: -consistent and regular instruction is good for education, -it is hard to expect students to wear a face covering for a full day, and -that we need to provide teachers time for our students that choose to distance learn.

We have engaged staff from all areas of the school to think about how we can mitigate risks in the most reasonable ways possible, from the bus to the classroom. We have also prepared for responding to the occurrence of COVID-19 in our school, so we can respond in ways that are thoughtful, appropriate and in line with public health guidelines.


In the pages to follow, you will see an in depth look at measures the school district is taking to return to school this fall, as well as general guidance for how each model of education will look. We know that the best educational setting for children is in our classrooms, but we are committed to providing a top notch education regardless of which scenario is required or our parents choose.

We take it very seriously that our parents trust us with their children every day, every year, and especially this year. By working together, not alone; focusing on solutions, not problems; and thinking critically, not critical, we can make this a great year of learning for our students.

# Kelliher School Return to Learn Guiding Principles

1. **Safety**: We believe the safety of children and adults is a priority. Safety includes not only the risks associated with infection and transmission of COVID-19, but also the mental health, physical health, and emotional health of children that is impacted when they are separated from peers and caring adults at school. Decisions based on safety should be backed by sound data and a comprehensive, whole child view of safety.
2. **Equity**: We believe that all children deserve the same access to a high quality education, regardless of their circumstances and access to support, digital tools, and resources.
3. **Educational Quality**: We believe that education happens best when children are instructed by a teacher and the best place for children to learn is in school whenever possible. Regular, consistent, and frequent contact with a teacher is important.
4. **Community**: As a school district, we provide an essential service to our community. Decisions made by the school affect parents, businesses, and the community as a whole.

# Kelliher School Decision Making Guidelines



## 1. Use the data and science

- a. We will use the most recent science, data, and model provided by the Minnesota Department of Health and the Minnesota department of Education as the basis for the model of schooling provided
- b. We will use knowledge of local data and circumstances to inform decisions
- c. We will consider infectiousness and transmission risk among different ages
- d. We will take trends into account

# Screening



## Operations

## Kelliher School Screening Expectations

- Parents will be expected to screen children prior to sending them to school each day, checking for symptoms. Guides like the one on the right will be provided to families.
- Staff will be trained on symptoms to look for and will monitor students for symptoms.
- Students showing symptoms will be referred to the nurse for further evaluation.
- Taking the temperature of individuals or classrooms of students will be implemented as the situation warrants. The district has purchased infrared thermometers if mass screening is necessary.

# Screening



## Kelliher School Staff Screening Expectations



### Operations

- Anyone with symptoms related to COVID-19 must contact the school office or their supervisor before coming to school or work. Symptoms include:

#### **ONE** of the following:

- Cough
- Shortness of breath
- Difficulty of breathing


**OR**

#### **TWO** of the following:

- Fever of 100.4 or more
- Sore throat
- Chills
- Muscle Pain
- New loss of taste or smell
- Nausea
- Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Headache
- Fatigue
- Congestion or runny nose
- Muscle or body aches

Screening expectations may change based on updated information from the MN Department of Health, Beltrami County Public Health, or the CDC.

# Confirmed Cases



## When there is a COVID-19 Case in the School



### Operations

Based on guidelines from the MN Departments of Health and Education, Beltrami County Public Health, and the CDC

1. If a positive case is identified the following steps will be taken:
  - a. The Superintendent or School Nurse will be notified
  - b. The Superintendent will contact MDH for the next steps and notify local public health officials
  - c. The Superintendent and School Nurse will provide information required for contract tracing to MDH and Beltrami County Public Health
2. MDH will take the following steps when notified of a positive case
  - a. MDH will provide guidance to the next steps and communication guidelines
  - b. Beltrami County Public Health will provide assistance with contact tracing and education for identified families
  - c. The Superintendent and School Nurse will work with MDH and Beltrami County Public Health to identify necessary next steps
3. The next steps will be taken with guidance from MDH:
  - a. Extra cleaning will be conducted in areas where the infected person spent time, the building may need to be closed for this
  - b. The Superintendent will develop messaging to all families and staff affected. Messaging will be completed in conjunction with MDH
  - c. The School Nurse will monitor symptoms of students and staff. Additional students and staff may be referred for testing or quarantined for 14 days to determine exposure



# Confirmed Cases



## Communicating Confirmed COVID-19 Cases at Kelliher School



### Operations

Based on guidelines from the MN Departments of Health and Education, Beltrami County Public Health, and the CDC

District staff will work closely with Beltrami County Public Health regarding confirmed cases of COVID-19, Kelliher School will:

- Communicate to all families in the school if there is a positive case
- Conduct extra cleaning in areas where the infected person spent time
- Work with Beltrami County Public Health and the MDH Regional Support Teams to identify and communicate with potential contacts
- Work with public health officials to determine if the status of the school must change
- Continue to monitor students and staff for COVID-19 symptoms

Due to data privacy, personally identifiable information about a person will not be shared

The Kelliher School will not immediately close school for one positive case, but will work with MDH and local public health officials to determine appropriate classroom or school status

# Day to Day



## Operations

## Face Coverings or Masks

- Per Executive Order, face coverings are **required** indoors, except when eating or drinking or if strenuous activity is taking place and social distancing is possible
- Face coverings include: a paper or disposable mask, a cloth mask, a neck gaiter, a scarf, a bandanna, etc.
- There are exceptions for students with medical, developmental, or behavioral conditions. Please speak with the Superintendent for details or questions
- Families are encouraged to have their children practice wearing face coverings before school starts
- 2 masks will be provided by the school district to all students and staff, but parents are encouraged to provide ones for their child
- The school will have extra face coverings as needed

## Individual School Supplies and Equipment

- As much as possible, students will have individual supplies
- Shared equipment will be cleaned between uses

## Visitors and Volunteers

- All visitors and volunteers are expected to self screen for COVID-19 symptoms and wear face coverings
- Visitors to the school will not be allowed beyond the main entry doors or main office

# Day to Day



## Operations

**Step 1:** Wash or sanitize your hands.



**Step 2:** Make sure the top of the mask is over your nose and the bottom is under your chin.



**Step 3:** Place the mask over your nose and mouth before you use the ear straps or tie it behind your head.



**Step 4:** Move the mask around so it covers nose, mouth, and chin completely.



**Step 5:** The tops of some masks can bend. Press your fingers on the top of the mask to make them fit tight around your nose.



**Step 6:** Do not touch the mask while wearing it. Use the mask ear straps or ties if you need to make it fit better.



**Step 7:** Use the mask ear straps or ties to take it off. Do not touch the front.



**Step 8:** Throw away if mask is disposable.



**Step 9:** Wash your mask by machine or by hand before you use it again.



**Step 10:** Wash or sanitize your hands again.

# Physical Spaces



## Operations

Based on guidelines from the MN Departments of Health and Education, Beltrami County Public Health, and the CDC



### Arranging Spaces for Physical Distancing

- Visitors to classrooms will not be allowed
- Classroom furniture will be arranged to maximize physical distancing
- Visual reminders for physical distancing will be placed throughout the school
- Plexiglass barriers will be placed in offices and other appropriate public spaces

### Building Traffic

- When possible, the passing times between classes will be altered and hallway markings will be instituted to limit student contact

### Cleaning and Disinfecting

- All products have been chosen in partnership with our health and safety consultants to mitigate COVID-19 and potential health impacts
- Increased daily and weekly enhanced cleaning and disinfecting by the building and grounds staff
- Increased classroom cleaning and disinfecting throughout the school day, especially in high touch and high traffic areas
- Additional tools and equipment have been purchased to facilitate increased cleaning
- Including: increased numbers of hand sanitizer dispensers

### Ventilation

- Kelliher Schools' HVAC system is comprised of 16 units which allow for full air exchange throughout the school every 10 minutes and are equipped with an antimicrobial HEPA filtration system
- Possible modifications to HVAC systems to increase input of outside air into the school may be explored



# Transportation



## Operations

### Kelliher School Student Transportation

- Students, drivers, and bus monitors are required to wear face coverings while on school transportation
- Additional communication and training will be provided for families, students, and staff to limit potential exposure
- Bus pick up areas on school property will be marked for physical distance (sidewalks)
- IEP driven accommodations will be reviewed with a commitment to finding solutions for families
- Bus capacities will be determined by MDE/MDH guidelines
- Physical distancing will occur on buses to the degree it is feasible
- Cleaning and disinfecting will take place following each route with special attention to high touch areas
- All ventilation systems will be inspected for proper operation. Outdoor air circulation will be increased where and when possible
- Hand sanitization will be installed on all district buses and made available in all school vehicles

# School Meals



## Operations

Based on guidelines from the MN Departments of Health and Education, Beltrami County Public Health, and the CDC

### Kelliher School Meal Service

- Menu items will be revised to include some self contained items
- Service and plating will be done by Food and Nutrition Staff
- Self service food items like salad bars will be removed
- Visual reminders for social distancing will be posted
- Alternatives to keypad will be implemented for student meal information
- Students are encouraged not to use their cell phones while in the lunch line
- Hand sanitizer will be readily available eating in their classrooms)
- Student groups will be established to reduce the number of close contacts
- Meal distribution will be available for families when in the distance learning model



# Staff Training and Expectations



## Operations

All staff will review the full Return to Learn Plan before resuming job duties. Protocols and expectations may change throughout the year as new information or restrictions are communicated. Staff are expected to implement new protocols immediately.

### **Kelliher School General Safety Expectations**

- Staff will maintain physical distance whenever possible
- Staff will comply with all face covering requirements
- Staff will follow all cleaning and disinfecting protocols
- Staff will screen for COVID-19 symptoms

Number of cases per 10,000 over 14 days, by county of residence	Learning Model
0-9	In-person learning for all students
10-19	In-person learning for elementary students; hybrid learning for secondary students
20-29	Hybrid learning for all students
30-49	Hybrid learning for elementary students; distance learning for secondary students
50+	Distance learning for all students



The ! symbols indicate counties whose category has gotten worse since the prior week. The • symbols indicate improvements.



# Kelliher School Model: In-Person



## In-Person Learning



### Instruction

Based on guidelines from the MN Departments of Health and Education, Beltrami County Public Health, and the CDC

The in-person model involves students attending school everyday for the typical length of time. While it most closely resembles a normal school experience, modifications will be made to the student experience and building to mitigate risks.

### Daily Instruction Plan

- Teachers and students will follow a typical **Monday** school schedule, with time built in for regular hygiene breaks and instruction
- Classroom furniture will be arranged to maximize physical distance
- Learning experiences may be modified or removed if they require close contact for prolonged periods of time
- All risk mitigation and expectations as described in the Operations portion of this plan will be followed
- Physical distancing, reducing travel, and other precautions will be taken whenever possible
- Weather permitting, children will go outdoors for recess and will be grouped by class
- Students who have chosen Distance Learning from home should expect to work independently and follow the assignments and work schedule set by their classroom teacher

# Kelliher School Model: Hybrid



## Hybrid Learning



### Instruction

Based on guidelines from the MN Departments of Health and Education, Beltrami County Public Health, and the CDC

**In a Hybrid learning model, class size and busing is limited to 50% of building capacity (not the same as enrollment) and social distancing guidelines need to be met. If capacity and distancing requirements cannot be met, students may need to attend every other day or on part time basis.**

### Daily Instruction Plan

- Student learning will be on site every school day, following the 2020-2021 school calendar
- The MONDAY class schedule will be used for each scheduled day, with the morning time dedicated to direct instruction of Distance Learning students (students needed to be dropped off at the school early before the 9:25 am start time on those days, should make arrangements with the school)
- Social distancing and building/room limits will be adhered to
- Weather permitting, children will go outdoors for recess and will be grouped by class
- Students who have chosen Distance Learning from home should expect to work independently and follow the assignments and work schedule set by their classroom teacher



# Kelliher School Model: Distance Learning



Instruction

Based on guidelines from the MN Departments of Health and Education, Beltrami County Public Health, and the CDC

**In the event of a COVID-19 outbreak in the building, ALL students may be moved temporarily to Distance Learning. Families not comfortable with any type of in person learning can also opt to 100% Distance Learning**

## Daily Instruction Plan

- Distance Learning will provide instruction at the same pace as if in the classroom
- A consistent daily schedule for Distance Learning can be expected to be a mix of structured and flexible learning
- Students will receive virtual instruction and interaction from teachers
- Parents may move their child to full Distance Learning at any point during the school year
- Parents wishing to move their child from Distance Learning to in-person or Hybrid learning should contact the Superintendent as schedules, classroom arrangements, transportation, and food service are based on the number of students in the building (it may take time to make the necessary accommodations for the child to return to school)


## **In-Person and Hybrid Learning Models**

- Teachers will take attendance hourly and/or daily, consistent with previous attendance practices

## **Distance Learning Model**

- When students are attending school under the Distance Learning Model from home, teachers will take attendance daily based on interactions with students, work completion, and engagement
- Students not engaging with daily work or engaging with learning will be marked absent and supports will be put in place to increase success

# Kelliher School Model: Grading



## Instruction

Based on guidelines from the MN Departments of Health and Education, Beltrami County Public Health, and the CDC

**Additional information is expected from the Minnesota Department of Education prior to the start of the school year. In all three learning scenarios, grades will not be the only feedback that students receive about their learning.**

- K-12 grading will be consistent with traditional practices, with letter grades being comprised of daily work, assignments, and assessments
- Grading will reflect learning, work completion, and school engagement
- Grades will be based on evidence of mastery of a subject. That mastery can be demonstrated in a variety of ways to allow for equity among learners
- A school wide philosophy regarding earning credits may be implemented during the Return to Learn time

# Kelliher School Model: School Readiness and VPK 3 & 4 year old Programing



Instruction

Based on guidelines from the MN Departments of Health and Education, Beltrami County Public Health, and the CDC



- These programs will follow the same daily calendar schedule Monday - Thursday as the rest of the school
- Depending on space availability, childcare may be available for families seeking options on the days when school is not in session (Friday)
- Special Education case managers will be communicating with individual families on their child's special education services during the in person and hybrid model, with distance learning as an option for special education service delivery
- MDH guidelines do not require masks for children under 5 year of age or enrolled into a School Readiness or VPK program

# Kelliher School Model: Special Education



## Instruction

Based on guidelines from the MN Departments of Health and Education, Beltrami County Public Health, and the CDC

### Daily Instruction Plan

- Teachers and students will follow their typical **Monday** schedule within each learning model and schools schedule
- IEP teams may determine modified learning experiences are needed if they require close contact for prolonged periods of time
- Return to Learn practices and protocols as previously described will be followed
- Face shield may be worn in place of face masks if a medical, developmental, or behavioral condition requires it (the IEP team will work with families as needed to make this determination)
- Families can elect Distance Learning if desired
- School staff and families will work collaboratively as and IEP team to develop IEP contingency learning plans for distance learning scenarios
- Special Education Staff will continue to provide services, collect data on goals, and report progress in accordance with the IEP and Contingency Learning Plans

### Instructional Technology Support

- Kelliher School technology staff will support families with technology needs, including individual device distribution, troubleshooting, repair, and helping families without Internet connectivity explore options
- Technology staff will support students in connecting with their teachers when engaged in distance learning
- FAQ's can be found on the school website

### Teacher-Family Communication

We recognize that teaching and learning in a distance model will require increased individual communication.

- All teachers will share the best time to reach them with questions or concerns
- Teachers will be teaching their Monday daily schedule and may not be immediately available to respond outside of office hours (7:45 - 9:00 am is a built in time slot when teachers should be more readily available)
- If a situation requires immediate attention, families school contact the school office

# Kelliher School Social and Emotional Support



## Support Services

### Student Supports

- School counseling, school social workers, and mental health supports and resources will be available for in person, hybrid, and distance learning models
- The school will provide support for students transitioning between instructional models
- The school will continue to identify and follow referral systems for individuals who need targeted support as well as access to school employed and community mental health professionals



# Kelliher School School-Age Care



## Support Services

## Student Supports

- Kelliher School will provide daycare services during regular school hours for children K-12 years of age for critical workers in Tier I of the state critical worker list as defined by the Governor's Executive Order (20-82)
- Face coverings will be required
- Children will be served in smaller groups that do not mix with other groups
- School transportation will not be provided
- School meal may be provided in conjunction with the school meal programs (paid and free/reduced rule apply, this will not be provided free like in the spring)

### MSHSL Approved Fall Training Seasons

Fall 2020

The MSHSL Board of Directors has approved the creation of optional Fall Training Seasons for volleyball, football, and MSHSL sanctioned spring sports\*. These Fall Training Seasons are MSHSL sponsored programs. All MSHSL member schools have the authority to provide the entire Training Season, offer a reduced Training Season, or choose not to offer a Training Season.

#### Volleyball and Football Fall Training Seasons:

- Start Date—September 14
- End Date—October 3
- Maximum Number of daily sessions per sport — 12

#### Spring Sport Fall Training Seasons\*:

- Start Date—October 5
- End Date—October 24
- Maximum Number of daily sessions per sport — 12

# Kelliher School Activities and Athletics

## MSHSL Sports Information

- Football and Volleyball were moved to a season running from mid March to mid May (this is being referred to as a fourth season)
- Spring activities will be shifted to a season running from mid May to July
- Participants may be allowed to ride with parents to contests to reduce busing capacities and increase distancing on buses
- Masks will not be required in activities that require physical exertion as outlined in MDH guidelines
- Students who enroll in a non-Kelliher School educational program are considered transfer students by the MSHSL and will be ineligible for competition, regardless of residency or if the re-enroll into the Kelliher School


## Concerts and Large Events

- Limited outdoor events may be offered with masked participants and physical distancing

- Field trips will not be offered during the fall. Additional communications will be provided to parents as we go through the school year
