- Send home Factwise Pairs Practice Tents to correlate with the student’s current goal.

### Parents Will

- Attend digital “BRIGHT” Nights and learn word problem strategies to help support learning.
- Read with student daily.
- Check and sign agenda each night. Write down the Title of the book their child read at night.
- Attend any necessary ZOOM Meetings with their child’s teacher.



### Students Will

- Encourage parents to attend digital “BRIGHT” Nights and work with parents at home on word problems.
- Read with parents daily to build comprehension.
- Remind parents to check and sign agenda each night.
- Practice Pairs Practice Tents each night.
