All Freshmen take **Western Civilizations I**, a full-year course that explores the emergence and growth of the Western world. Main topics of study include Ancient Greece & Rome, Medieval Europe, the Renaissance, the Reformation, and the Age of Exploration—a period covering nearly 6,000 years.

In addition to content, instruction will also focus on skill development, especially related to critical thinking, reading, writing, research, public speaking, geography, and primary source analysis.

Parents and students are advised to follow the recommendation of their 8th grade teacher when completing the course selection process. This course is offered at Honors, Academic, and General levels.
