In order to help keep our students and staff healthy this cold and flu season, we have emptied our cleaning supplies and are ordering more as they become available. We also want to ensure our students are coming to school ready to learn. This means when our students are sick, they take proper care of themselves. Sometimes this means they stay home from school to recover more quickly.

We ask that **students with a fever or any type of respiratory illness, stay home**. We want our students to be healthy and recover quickly. Students should feel well enough to go about their normal student behaviors throughout the day, such as staying awake during class, keeping their heads up/sitting up, eating lunch, walking from class-to-class, etc.






