





# District MAP Comparison (WINTER Administration)

### 3<sup>rd</sup> grade Reading:

In terms of ACHEIEVEMENT (how well they are meeting grade level standards, etc.), 2<sup>nd</sup> in the county with 82%.

In terms of GROWTH (Fall to Winter...how much our students grew), we scored in the 77<sup>th</sup> percentile. NOTE: We have always been told that individually and as a whole, we want students above that 50<sup>th</sup> percentile mark.

#### 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade Math:

In terms of ACHIEVEMENT, we scored 2<sup>nd</sup> at 69%.

In terms of Growth (Fall to Winter), you all scored in the 91st percentile.

# 4<sup>th</sup> Grade Reading:

In terms of ACHEIEVEMENT, we tied for 2<sup>nd</sup> in the county with 81%.

In terms of GROWTH (Fall to Winter...how much they grew), we scored in the 82<sup>nd</sup> percentile.

### 4<sup>th</sup> Grade Math:

In terms of ACHIEVEMENT, we scored 1<sup>st</sup> in the county at the 73<sup>rd</sup> percentile.

In terms of Growth (Fall to Winter), we scored in the 99th percentile.

# 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Reading:

In terms of ACHEIEVEMENT, we are 1st in the county with 84%

In terms of GROWTH (Fall to Winter...how much they grew), we scored in the 29th percentile.

### 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Math:

In terms of ACHIEVEMENT, we scored 2<sup>nd</sup> in the county at the 71<sup>st</sup> percentile

In terms of Growth (Fall to Winter), we scored in the 76<sup>th</sup> percentile.

### **Next Steps:**

- -We met with teachers regarding assessment data regarding individual scores, grade level, and school/county wide
- -Teachers used a triangulation of data (MAP, BEACON (state formative assessment that looks like GMAS), unit assessments) to determine a plan for the next several months before GMAS
