#### Reading Instruction

##### Objectives

- 75% of PPS 1st GR students will perform at a 1.2 during winter assessment and progress to a minimum of 1.8 by spring assessment.
- 75% of PPS 2nd GR students will progress from a 2.2 on STAR reading to a 2.5 on winter assessment and to a minimum of 2.8 on the spring assessment.
- Students will move from \*\* proficiency on the DIBELS mCLASS (TBD)

##### Critical Initiatives

- Reaching all learners: differentiated instruction, multi-sensory and RTI strategies will be incorporated through both whole and small group lessons in language arts for all

#### Math Instruction

##### Objectives

- 75% of 1st Grade students will progress from 1.0 on STAR Math to 1.4 during winter, to 1.8 by May 2021.
- 75% of 2nd grade students will progress from 1.9 on STAR Math to 2.3 during winter, to 2.8 by May 2021.
